the present state and future needs series had its roots in the dark days of the early 1960s when morale in general practice was low and when numbers of new entrants were actually going down they were the days of mass emigration of doctors from Britain and the National Health Service the fourth and fifth editions were entitled trends in general practice 1977 and 1979

the aim of the 100 cases series is to provide a novel learning and revision tool that works by guiding the student through clinical cases imitating those that students and foundation year doctors are likely to meet in a general practice setting the cases are written to interest students in clinical problems and to help them develop their skills

this study of general practice and the attitudes of patients and general practitioners to it is the most significant book yet written about the NHS this was how the reviewer in the British Medical Journal reviewed Ann Cartwright's earlier book patients and their doctors in general practice revisited originally published in 1981 Ann Cartwright and Robert Anderson compare the experiences and views described in the first study carried out in 1964 with those revealed by a second survey in 1977 in the intervening period there were a great many changes in the organization of general practice for example appointment systems and nurses working in the surgery became the rule rather than the exception and the number of doctors working in health centres or using deputizing services rose dramatically this study shows how the basic patient doctor relationship has been affected by these changes a fundamental feature of the survey is the demonstration that the attitudes and practices of patients and doctors are linked and that it is possible to relate the experiences and degree of satisfaction of patients to the doctor's age sex size of practice equipment ancillary help and indeed to the doctor's views and habits by bringing the picture of general practice up to date Ann Cartwright and Robert Anderson provided the basic data for any discussion of primary health care in this country at the time

this is a history of general practice under the National Health Service covering the whole of the first 50 years from 1948 to the present

this book presents a series of tutorials that resulted from a debate between a trainer and a trainee in general practice to find what the trainee needed to learn what it was the trainer had to teach and how this might be achieved the aim is to give the reader a fundamental understanding of the conditions encountered in general practice and a summary of of the organization of health care in the uk each chapter contains an introductory paragraph giving basic information about the problem or symptom which can be obtained from a review of the literature on the nature of the problem its incidence and prevalence and a comment on its significance this is followed by a brief outline of a case as it is presented the presentation is divided into steps and the tutorial discussion takes place as the problem unfolds the tutorial emphasizes the history and examination thought to be relevant and discusses issues which were raised finally where possible the outcome of the case is recorded and a summary of the teaching points is given for any future revision the second edition of this textbook contains two new chapters on the nature of the tutorial and the gp s new contract
