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islam and the destiny of man by charles le gai eaton is a wide ranging study of the muslim religion from a unique point of view the author a former member of the british diplomatic service was brought up as an agnostic and embraced islam at an early age after writing a book commissioned by t s eliot on eastern religions and their influence upon western thinkers as a muslim he has retained his adherence to the perennial philosophy which he maintains underlies the teachings of all the great religions the aim of this book is to explore what it means to be a muslim a member of a community which embraces a quarter of the world's population and to describe the forces which have shaped the hearts and the minds of islamic people after considering the historic confrontation between islam and christendom and analysing the difference between the three monotheistic faiths judaism christianity and islam the author describes the two poles of muslim belief in terms of truth and mercy the unitarian truth which is the basis of the muslim's faith and the mercy inherent in this truth in the second part of the book he explains the significance of the qur'an and tells the dramatic story of muhammad's life and of the early

caliphate lastly the author considers the muslim view of man s destiny the social structure of islam the role of art and mysticism and the inner meaning of islamic teaching concerning the hereafter throughout this book the author is concerned not with the religion of islam in isolation but with the very nature of religious faith its spiritual and intellectual foundations and the light it casts upon the mysteries and paradoxes of the human condition

an accessible transregional exploration of how islam and asia have shaped each other s histories societies and cultures from the seventh century to today

answers many common questions about muslims and islam discussing the faith s views on jesus jihad women marriage and other topics

examining the theoretical problems which arose when the modern european ideology of nationalism was adopted by muslim societies organized into formally modern states this book first published in 1987 also deals with the practical difficulties arising from the doctrinal incompatibility between islam and the non muslim concept of the territorial nation state it illustrates this conflict with a consideration of the record of several states in the islamic world it suggests that whereas the state an organization of power has been a most durable institution in islamic history the legitimacy of the nation state has always been challenged in favour of the wide islamic nation the umma which comprises all the faithful without reference to territorial boundaries to this extent too the more recent conception of arab nationalism projects a far larger nation state than the existing territorial states in the arab world today this title will be of interest to students of middle eastern studies

hailed in the new york times book review as the doyen of middle eastern studies bernard lewis has been for half a century one of the west s foremost scholars of islamic history and culture the author of over two dozen books most notably the arabs in history the emergence of modern turkey the political language of islam and the muslim discovery of europe eminent french historian robert mantran has written of lewis s work how could one resist being attracted to the books of an author who opens for you the doors of an unknown or misunderstood universe who leads you within to its innermost domains religion ways of thinking conceptions of power culture an author who upsets notions too often fixed fallacious or partisan in islam and the west bernard lewis brings together in one volume eleven essays that indeed open doors to the innermost domains of islam lewis ranges far and wide in these essays he includes long pieces such as his capsule history of the interaction in war and peace in commerce and culture between europe and its islamic neighbors and shorter ones such as his deft study of the arabic word watan and what its linguistic history reveals about the introduction of the idea of patriotism from the west lewis offers a revealing look at edward gibbon s portrait of muhammad in decline and fall of the roman empire unlike previous writers gibbon saw the rise of islam not as something separate and isolated nor as a regrettable aberration from the onward march of the church but simply as a part of human history he offers a devastating critique of edward said s controversial book orientalism and he gives an account of the impediments to translating from classic arabic to other languages the old dictionaries for one are packed with scribal errors misreadings false analogies and etymological deductions that pay

little attention to the evolution of the language and he concludes with an astute commentary on the islamic world today examining revivalism fundamentalism the role of the shi a and the larger question of religious co existence between muslims christians and jews a matchless guide to the background of middle east conflicts today islam and the west presents the seasoned reflections of an eminent authority on one of the most intriguing and little understood regions in the world

tariq ramadan presents analysis of the arab spring focusing on the role played by islam in the uprisings and considering what its position will be in the new societies taking shape

islam like the west is not a homogenous monolith however islam is most commonly represented in the west in terms of suicide bombing suppressed and veiled women and internal and external conflict these depictions of islam suggest that the relationship between islam and the west is and has always been one of hostility and hatred however this collection locates threads of connection and love between islam and the west and argues that it is important to bring them to the forefront i

this book explores the development of islam and the baha i faith in the nineteenth century via the examination of two key reformers

featuring immanuel wallerstein joseph massad marnia lazreg and other well known and emerging new authors this book seeks a more accurate understanding of islam and islamic societies role and relations to global cultural and economic realities the book confronts a trend today of analyzing islam as a cultural system that stands outside of and even predates modernity the authors see this trend as part of a racist discourse unaware of the realities of contemporary islam islamic societies today are products of the world capitalist system and cannot be understood as being separate from its forces the authors offer a more carefully constructed and richer portrait of islamic societies today and forcefully challenge the belief that islam is not part of nor much affected by the modern world system

this book compares islamic and western political formulations highlighting areas of agreement and disparity building on this analysis the author goes on to show that political islam offers a serious alternative to the dominant political system and ideology of the west sabet argues that rather than leading to a clash of civilizations or the assimilation of islam into the western system a positive process of interactive self reflection between islam and liberal democracy is the best way forward beginning this process sabet highlights key concepts of islamic political thought and brings them into dialogue with western modernity the resulting synthesis is essential reading for advanced undergraduate and graduate students of islamic and middle eastern politics political theory comparative politics and international relations

national identity and liberal democracy are recurrent themes in debates about muslim minorities in the west britain is no exception with politicians responding to claims about muslims lack of integration by mandating the promotion of fundamental british values including democracy and individual liberty this book engages with both these themes addressing the lack of understanding about the character of british islam and its relationship to the liberal state it charts a gradual but decisive shift in british institutions concerned with islamic education islamic law and muslim representation since muslims settled in the uk in large numbers in the 1950s based on empirical research including interviews undertaken over a ten year period with muslims and analysis of public events organized by islamic institutions stephen jones challenges claims about the isolation of british islamic organizations and shows that they have decisively shaped themselves around british public and institutional norms he argues that this amounts to the building of a distinctive british islam using this narrative the book makes the case for a variety of liberalism that is open to the expression of religious arguments in public and to associations between religious groups and the state it also offers a powerful challenge to claims about the insularity of british islamic institutions by showing how the national orientation of islam called for by british policymakers is in fact already happening

since its origins in the deserts of arabia fourteen centuries ago islam has grown until today it has one and a half billion followers nearly a quarter of mankind today islam is feared and distrusted by much of the western world for its association with religious extremism and terrorism although the vast majority of muslims believe only in peace love and service to allah and assert that extremism has no place in their faith

islam and contemporary civilisation examines the most complex debates and dilemmas facing islam today both internally and in its relations with western civilisation halim rane provides a concise and comprehensive introduction to islam and modern developments in muslim thought and tackles questions of islamic law human rights democracy jihad and the israel palestine conflict in the context of islam west relations in confronting these challenging issues rane proposes a way forward that has far reaching implications for advancing mutual understanding and finding common ground between the muslim world and the west

the book examines the growing tension between social movements that embrace egalitarian and inclusivist views of national and global politics most notably classical liberalism and those that advance social hierarchy and national exclusivism such as neoliberalism neoconservatism and national populism in exploring issues relating to tensions and conflicts around globalization the book identifies historical patterns of convergence and divergence rooted in the monotheistic traditions beginning with the ancient israelites that dominated the near east during the axial age through islamic civilization and finally by considering the idealism realism tensions in modern times one thing remained constant throughout the various historical stages that preceded our current moment of global convergence a recurring tension between transcendental idealism and various forms of realism transcendental idealism which prioritize egalitarian and universal values pushed periodically against the forces of realism that privilege established law and power structure equipped with the idealism realism framework the book examines the consequences of european realism that justified the imperialistic venture into africa the middle east and latin america in the name of liberation and liberalization the ill conceived strategy has ironically engendered the very dysfunctional societies that produce the waves of immigrants in constant motion from the south to the north simultaneously as it fostered the social hierarchy that transfer external tensions into identity politics within the countries of the north the book focuses particularly on the role played historically by islamic rationalism in translating the monotheistic egalitarian outlook into the institutions of religious pluralism legislative and legal autonomy and scientific enterprise at the foundation of modern society it concludes by shedding light on the significance of the muslim presence in western cultures as humanity draws slowly but consistently towards what we may come to recognize as the global age the open access version of this book available at taylorfrancis com books e 9781003203360 has been made available under a creative commons attribution non commercial no derivatives 4 0 license

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
