and accessibility issues for elderly or disabled learners they also examine advanced technologies that hold potential for the enhancement of learner immersion and discuss best practices in the design and implementation of virtual world based learning interventions and tasks by evaluating and documenting different methods approaches and strategies the contributors to learning in virtual worlds offer important information and insight to both scholars and practitioners in the field
