born in 1989 to wealthy american parents in upstate new york american surrealist painter kay sage

became a member of the surrealist art movement in paris in 1937 along with an eloquent chronicle of sage s life judith suther shows how not only sage s art but also the iconoclastic themes of her poetic works were related to sage s lifelong revolt against social and artistic convention 78 illustrations 10 color plates

arranged in alphabetical order these 5 volumes encompass the history of the cultural development of america with over 2300 entries

williams college in williamstown ma has collected art since the mid 19th century in this chronological journey through american art in all media each of 56 highlighted objects from the museum receives a mini essay of several hundred words signed by contributors who frequently are the acknowledged experts on particular artists or works a full factual entry on each work appears at the back of the book preceded by extremely brief summaries of the acquisitions histories of the overall collection s painting drawing sculpture williams portraits prints photographs posters and decorative arts college alumni donated many items including collections on rube goldberg thomas nast and the prendergasts this is not the definitive book on american art but it is an excellent survey with many interesting objects not commonly reproduced for art history collections 64 colour 65 b w illustrations

surrealism was ostensibly directed at the emancipation of the human spirit but it represented only male aspirations and fantasies until a number of women artists began to redefine its agenda in the later 1930s this book addresses the former using a thick description of the historically specific circumstances which required the male surrealists to manufacture a sexual reputation of narcissism

and misogyny these circumstances were determined by hegemonic masculinity an ideological construct which had little to do with individual masculinities in male surrealism the beribboned bomb signified something both attractive and volatile a specific instance of the surrealist principle of convulsive beauty in hegemonic masculinity similar devices served as metaphors of the sexuality all men were supposed to possess the intersection of these two axes produced an imagery of unrepentant violence
