leela dube addresses a range of interrelated themes in the study of gender kinship and culture the book draws upon a variety of distinct and unusual materials to construct ethnographic readings of a feminist imagination three substantive themes are addressed in this book which are complemented by dube s discussion of gender relations in a matrilineal muslim culture in a small island society
