the tractatus logico philosophicus is the only book length philosophical work by the austrian philosopher wittgenstein that was published during his lifetime the project had a broad goal to identify the relationship between language and reality

a holistic introduction to wittgenstein s philosophy that approaches him as a philosopher of ordinary life one of philosopher ludwig wittgenstein s most consequential claims was that the meaning of the word its sense is its use in language this deceptively simple claim the foundation of what became known as ordinary language philosophy has animated thinkers across disciplinary bounds from metaphysics to ethics and more in the senses of use sandra laugier embarks on a fresh journey through wittgenstein s corpus that emphasizes the place of ordinary life and language in its thought through his tractatus logico philosophicus philosophical investigations and rich posthumously published works laugier offers a compelling new look at wittgenstein as a philosopher of mind

on 25 october 1946 in a crowded room in cambridge ludwig wittgenstein and karl popper came face to face for the first and only time the encounter lasted only ten minutes and did not go well almost immediately rumours started to spread around the world that the two philosophers had come to blows armed with red hot poker

and works the authors resist any reduction of wittgenstein s philosophy to remarks on pedagogy while addressing the current controversy surrounding the role of training in the enculturation process significant events in his education and life are examined as the background for successful interpretation without lending biographical details explanatory force the book discusses the importance of wittgenstein s training and dismissal as an elementary teacher 1920 26 in light of his later frequent use 1930s 40s of many scenes of instruction in his cambridge lectures and notebooks these depictions culminated in his now famous philosophical investigations a counter to his earlier philosophy in the tractatus wittgenstein came to distinguish between empirical inquiries into how education language or mathematics might ideally work from grammatical studies of how we learn on the rough ground to normatively go on as others do often without explicit rules and with considerable degrees of ambiguity for instance in implementing new guidelines during a curriculum reform or in evaluating teachers the book argues that wittgenstein s reflections on education spanning from mathematics training to the acquisition of language and cultivation of aesthetic appreciation are of central significance to both the man and his pedagogical style of philosophy

exploring the ethical dimension of wittgenstein s thought iczkovits challenges the view that wittgenstein had a vision of language and subsequently a vision of ethics showing how the two are integrated in his philosophical method and allowing us to reframe traditional problems in moral philosophy considered as external to questions of meaning

this book collects 13 papers that explore wittgenstein s philosophy throughout the different stages of his career the author writes from the viewpoint of critical rationalism the tone of his analysis is friendly and appreciative yet critical of these papers seven are on the background to the philosophy of wittgenstein five papers examine different aspects of it one on the philosophy of young wittgenstein one on his transitional period and the final three on the philosophy of mature wittgenstein chiefly his philosophical investigations the last of these papers which serves as the concluding chapter concerns the analytical school of philosophy that grew chiefly under its influence wittgenstein s posthumous philosophical investigations ignores formal languages while retaining the view of metaphysics as meaningless declaring that all languages are metaphysics free it was very popular in the middle of the twentieth century now it is passé wittgenstein had hoped to dissolve all philosophical disputes yet he generated a new kind of dispute his claim to have improved the philosophy of life is awkward just because he prevented philosophical discussion from the ability to achieve that he cut the branch on which he was sitting this according to the author is the most serious critique of wittgenstein

wittgenstein s later writings generate a great deal of controversy and debate as do the implications of his ideas for such topics as consciousness knowledge language and the arts oswald hanfling addresses a widespread tendency to ascribe to wittgenstein views that go beyond those he actually held separate chapters deal with important topics such as the private language argument rule following the problem of other minds and the ascription of scepticism to wittgenstein describing wittgenstein as a humanist

thinker he contrasts his views on language art humanity and philosophy itself with those of scientifically minded philosophers he argues that the human form of life calls for a kind of understanding that cannot be achieved by the methods of empirical science that consciousness for example cannot properly be regarded as a property of the brain and that the resulting problem of consciousness is an illusion wittgenstein and the human form of life is essential reading for anyone interested in wittgenstein's approach to what it means to be human it will be invaluable to all wittgenstein scholars and all who are interested in the philosophy of mind language and aesthetics
