making research relevant is the ideal core textbook for master s level introduction to research methods courses in any mental health field accessible and user friendly it is designed to help trainees and practitioners understand connect and apply research to clinical practice and day to day work with students and clients the text covers foundational concepts such as research ethics the consumption of research and how to analyze data as well as an additional 11 applied evaluative and outcome based research methods that can be applied in practice easy to read conversational chapters are infused with case examples from diverse settings paired with brief video lectures and a practice based application section which provide vignettes and practice to guide application and visual components that demonstrate how research methods can benefit mental health practitioners in real world scenarios

this is the first book to focus on participatory research in the context of sport and physical activity it explores the transformative potential of participatory research methods and provides an introduction to the practicalities of doing participatory research in sport and physical activity the book is structured around phases of the research process covering research design data collection data analysis and knowledge mobilization and translation chapters cover research design topics such as building research partnerships reflexivity and ethical issues methods such as social photo elicitation go along interviews and biographical mapping analytical approaches such as collective memory work and collaborative analysis and knowledge mobilization and translation topics such as podcasting digital tools and peer review every chapter includes a review of key developments a guide to how that approach can be employed an example from the author s own work and critical reflections on how that approach can shape future research and have an impact on public discourse this book is an invaluable resource for students and researchers working in sport studies the sociology

of sport sport and exercise psychology sport management and policy and human movement and health studies more broadly it will be particularly useful for those interested in diverse and inclusive approaches to qualitative research methodologies

this book is a compilation of more than 70 qualitative research concepts that are used by researchers and practitioners in the social sciences and humanities the concepts include methods and methodologies applied in qualitative research in various contexts each concept is a standalone chapter that is authored by a researcher or practitioner who has had some scholarly experience with it the chapters are alphabetized using the titles of the concepts to provide easy access for readers they follow a prescribed outline which ensures homogeneity in the layout of the book each chapter starts with a brief historical background of the concept followed by a concise description of the concept and the process used in its application readers are then provided with the possible ways in which the concept can be used and its benefits each chapter concludes by providing readers with some strengths and limitations of the concept and a list of references that authors have used in the chapter
