

A Shared World Christians And Muslims In The Early Modern Mediterranean

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today muslims are the second largest religious group in much of europe and north america the essays in this collection look both at the impact of the growing muslim population on western societies and how muslims are adapting to life in the west part i looks at the muslim diaspora in europe comprising essays on britain france germany switzerland norway sweden denmark italy and the netherlands part ii turns to the western hemisphere and muslims in the u s canada and mexico throughout the authors contend with such questions as can muslims retain their faith and identity and at the same time accept and function within the secular and pluralistic traditions of europe and america what are the limits of western pluralism will muslims come to be fully accepted as fellow citizens with equal rights an excellent guide to the changing landscape of islam this volume is an indispensable introduction to the experiences of muslims in the west and the diverse responses of their adopted countries

islam is a major religion in southeast asia with indonesian muslims comprising the largest muslim population in the world events and developments since 11 september 2001 have added greater attention to islam and its adherents in this part of the world this general survey of islam in southeast asia is intended to inform explain and update readers about the more significant aspects of islam in southeast asia then and now these include the following the geographical origins and sources by which the faith spread in this region the social economic and political profiles of the muslim communities relations between muslims and non muslims and between muslims and the state the strands and trends that shapes the role of islam and the muslims in the national body politic and the challenges confronting muslims in confronting the vicissitudes of their lives in this era of rapid change characterized by modernization capitalism secularization and globalization the discussion will begin with an overview of the broad

picture of islam and the muslims in the region as a whole covering both muslim majority and muslim minority countries this will be followed by case study analysis of islam and the muslims in individual countries indonesia malaysia brunei singapore thailand philippines myanmar vietnam cambodia and laos given the difficulty of writing on such a complex and contentious topic this book attempts to present the subject matter in a manner that is sufficiently objective to scholars and yet simple and accessible enough to be readily understood by ordinary readers

although more than half of the world s muslims live in asia most books on contemporary islam focus on the middle east giving short shift to the dynamic and diverse presence of asian islam in regional and global politics the muslims of asia constitute the largest muslim communities in the world indonesia pakistan bangladesh india and central asia in recent years terrorist bombings in bali separatist conflicts in thailand and the philippines and opposition politics in central asia all point to the strategic importance of asian islam in asian islam in the 21st century terrorism and its effects are placed within the broader context of muslim politics and how islamic ideals and movements mainstream and extremist have shaped asian muslim societies democratization experiments successful and unsuccessful are examined the rise of radical militant movements is analyzed and placed in historical perspective the result is an insightful portrait of the rich diversity of muslim politics and discourse that continue to affect asian muslim majority and minority countries specialists and students of islamic studies religion and international affairs and comparative politics as well as general readers will benefit from this sorely needed comprehensive analysis of a part of the world that has become increasingly important in the 21st century

the bombings in new york and washington in 2001 and subsequent terrorist attacks in different countries of the west have led to fast changing socio cultural and political contexts where islam has been depicted as a global threat the meaning of being a muslim has undergone rapid transformation with the interplay of perceptions and misperceptions impacted by for instance the iranian revolution of 1978 9 the lockerbie

bombing in 1988 the gulf war of 1990 1 and the clash of civilizations thesis propagated by samuel huntington in 1993 this book examines the way muslims and mainstream societies in the west perceive each other by taking into account themes like cultural pluralism media religious education interfaith dialogue and so on it argues that muslims are not defined solely by their faith but as an emerging group which is self critical reflective and focused on clearing the misconceptions associated with their identity further it posits that westerners who are more knowledgeable about muslims usually express positive opinions about islam thereby arguing that the knowledge about and attitudes towards islam are interrelated

suspicion and clashes accompany the settlement of muslims in european cultures this book explores a case in point muslims in the netherlands both muslim and non muslim authors contribute to the debate about the future of islam in this new context contributions range from the position of muslim women in debates about the headscarf to the attempts by muslims to set up a viable academic training centre for imams to allow cross cultural comparissions the volume also contains reflections from other parts of europe

muslims are neither new nor foreign to the united states they have been a vital presence in north america since the 16th century muslims in america unearths their history documenting the lives of african middle eastern south asian european black white hispanic and other americans who have been followers of islam the book begins with the tale of job ben solomon a 18th century african american muslim slave and goes on to chart the stories of sodbusters in north dakota african american converts to islam in the 1920s muslim barkeepers in toledo the post 1965 wave of professional immigrants from asia and africa and muslim americans after 9 11 the book reveals the richness of sunni shi a sufi and other forms of islamic theology ethics and rituals in the united states by illustrating the way islamic faith has been imagined and practiced in the everyday lives of individuals muslims in america recovers the place of muslims in the larger american story too showing how muslim american men and women participated in each era of u s history the book explores how they have both shaped and have been shaped by larger historical trends such as the abolition movement gilded age immigration the great migration of african americans urbanization religious revivalism the feminist movement and the current war on terror it also shows how from the very beginning of american history muslim americans have been at once a part of their local communities their nation and the worldwide community of muslims the first single author history of muslims in america from colonial times to the present this book fills a huge gap and provides invaluable background on one of the most poorly understood groups in the united states religion in american life explores the evolution character and dynamic of organized religion in america from 1500 to the present day written by distinguished historians of religion these books weave together the varying stories that compose the religious fabric of the united states from puritanism to alternative religious practices primary source material coupled with handsome illustrations and lucid text make these books essential in any exploration of america s diverse nature each book includes a chronology suggestions for further reading and an index

based on a reading of classical islamic literature the writings of modern muslims and on extensive travel and interviews this book discusses ways in which muslim peoples adapt themselves to a world composed of sovereign nation states having peaceful and equal relations with both non muslim states and collectivities of other muslims the classical and medieval legal theory of islam appears to place two obstacles in the way of such adaptations it divides the world into two areas muslim and non muslim between which relations can at best be those of truce and it demands that the life of societies should be regulated by the will of god as revealed in the qu ran not by the will of rulers or of the people dr piscatori shows that the traditional theory provides for some degree of territorial pluralism which has been clearly reflected in the historical experience whereby stable nation states have emerged and become part of the international order

this series of volumes on the manifold facets of islamic culture is intended to acquaint a very wide public with the theological bases of its faith the status of the individual and of society in the islamic world its expansion since the revelation its cultural manifestations in literature and the arts and finally islam today between loyalty to its past and the new challenges of modernity the last 100 years of islamic history are examined in the final volume although the approach is thematic rather than historical the period considered has seen european colonialism in most of the islamic world and islam has played a major role in the initiation and organization of resistance movements we survey the groupings and forms of co operation that have arisen since liberation from colonialism and investigate the political necessity and the moral stand that underlie the unity of the islamic peoples social and economic progress is reviewed and space is devoted to such topics as the ongoing problem of palestine moves towards educational reform and the status of women in islam as the islamic world cannot be imagined in isolation this volume examines the attitude of contemporary islam towards other religions and cultures and considers efforts aimed at achieving mutual understanding and coexistence

in both muslim and non muslim countries

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
