this book merges and harmonizes the four gospels of matthew mark luke and john into one this unified version which i call the gospel is based on the faith that the four different gospels exist in order to form together the complete story of jesus life and ministry i consolidated these sources by identifying common denominators among them as well as parts that are unique to each and then interweaving it all into a single narrative using only original texts this integrated version may offer greater incentive to our youth laymen and non believers as well as professionals to read and learn more about what jesus did and taught acts 1 1 in the past there have been many attempts to make the four gospels easier for readers often displaying similar episodes in parallel columns in an effort to resolve the gospels narrative complexity by harmonizing them in one way or another however in regard to the text itself previous books do not rise to the level of precision and completeness that is achieved here answering this need for a clear chronological telling of the story of jesus this book unifies every account of the four gospels into a single story without omitting or compromising any part on a given topic in jesus ministry this book uses as its base whichever gospel is the greatest common denominator consolidates identical or similar parts from other gospels and integrates the unique and different elements of each book into a single story

paul told the romans the law is holy and the commandment is holy and righteous and good yet four times in three epistles he wrote we are not under law but under grace christians read these seemingly conflicting statements and are easily confused they wonder if anyone can understand how the law and the old testament relates to their faith some take the easy way out and all but ignore the old testament calling it legalism they prefer to concentrate on and enjoy the magnificent grace of god that comes with salvation this limits their understanding of the scriptures and indeed restricts spiritual growth confusion further abounds because just about every denomination has a different interpretation of the law and the relationship between the testaments lester stephenson proposes a different approach rooted in jesus words in matthew 5 17 18 do not think that i came to abolish the law or the prophets i did not come to abolish but to fulfill for truly i say to you until heaven and earth pass away not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the law until all is accomplished those two verses call for christians to look anew at the law and the rest of the old testament not one part of the law or what the prophets wrote will pass away until jesus has completely fulfilled it stephenson stresses that christians must recognize the importance of the bible that jesus and the apostles used each time jesus and the apostles used the phrase it is written they were using an old testament passage to illustrate a new testament principle in a biblicist view of law and gospel stephenson advocates a biblicist view based on careful bible study to explain how christians are to view the law and the way the testaments fit together as an inspired whole

in mark s gospel the shema language of deut 6 4 is not merely reiterated in a traditional sense but reinterpreted in a striking way that links jesus directly and inseparably with israel s unique god such an innovative rereading of the shema must be understood in light of a various elements involved in and surrounding each of the three monotheistic references mark 2 7 10 18 12 29 relating to their respective literary contexts and b mark s nuanced complex and even paradoxical portrait of jesus relationship to god throughout his gospel john j r lee shows that mark s use of the one god language implies that his jesus is not merely one who as a shema observant jew speaks on behalf of god but also one whose status and significance fundamentally correspond to those of israel s unique deity
