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world's most popular short stories is a collection of tales that are soothing yet scintillating motivational and magical and a gentle mix of the common and the special handpicked stories by four master craftsmen Guy de Maupassant Anton Chekhov O. Henry and Saki will not only give you a taste of their contemporary societies and cultures but also take you on an adventure of a lifetime their extraordinary stories are a mixture of tragedy and humorous satire irony and the macabre in which the stupidities and hypocrisy of conventional society are viciously pilloried you will meet the common folks who love to spend evenings in the company of girls and you will also meet couples from humble origins working hard to repay a debt which was wrongly assumed in the first place you can run into love seeking you in some stories and destiny waiting to change the course of lives in others the heady mix of humour satire and drama makes these stories an essential cocktail of emotions

these 13 short stories by 5 authors of the era include 4 tales by Miguel de Unamuno along with the works of Valle Inclán Blasco Ibáñez Baroja and Azorín José Martínez Ruiz

this collection contains works by such writers as Poe Hawthorne Gaskell Dickens and M. R. James it brings together stories from the earliest decades of gothic writing with later 19th and early 20th century tales

beginning in the 1890s reaching its first full realization by modernist writers in the 1920s and brought to its heyday during the Canadian Renaissance starting in the 1960s the short story has become Canada's flagship genre it continues to attract the country's most

accomplished and innovative writers today among them margaret atwood mavis gallant alice munro carol shields and many others yet in contrast to the stature and popularity of the genre and the writers who partake in it surprisingly little literary criticism and theory has been devoted to the canadian short story this collection redresses that imbalance by providing the first collection of critical interpretations of a range of thirty well known and often anthologized canadian short stories from the genre s beginnings through the twentieth century a historical survey of the genre introduces the volume and a timeline comparing the genre s development in canada the us and great britain via representative examples completes it the collection is geared both to specialists in and to students of canadian literature for the latter it is of particular benefit that the volume provides not only a collection of interpretations but a comprehensive introduction to the history of the canadian short story reingard m nischik is professor and chair of american literature at the university of constance germany

brings together 28 lively and readable stories many of which are re published here for the first time since their original appearance includes fiction by maria edgeworth mary shelley elizabeth gaskell and margaret oliphant

Before there were lovable hobbits and *Game of Thrones* and kid wizards named Harry Potter, there were the 10 best fantasy short stories published in English during the first half of the nineteenth century. These excellent stories have been uncovered by Andrew Barger, award-winning editor of *The Best Horror Short Stories 1800-1849* and *Blood & Death: The Best Vampire Short Stories 1800-1849*. In old magazines and forgotten journals, Andrew read well over 100 fantasy short stories and settled on the very best for this fantasy anthology. He provides a list at the back of the collection of the stories considered, along with the author and year of publication. Andrew further

if you can t decide which new novel or nonfiction book to pick up here s another idea try reading a short story collection rather than focus on a singular narrative these unique options weave together the voices of several writers or focus on multiple stories by an author you know and love short stories are tiny windows into other worlds and other minds and other dreams they are journeys you can make to the far side of the universe and still be back in time for dinner

in this edition of marvels of short stories we have gathered five stories by heinrich von kleist 1777 1811 considered one of the greatest gothic writers of german literature each story is a masterpiece that offers an exciting and intense journey to the reader with surprising twists and complex and intriguing characters the earthquake in chile and the beggarwoman of locarno are two stories that present kleist s darker and more disturbing side exploring themes such as violence and injustice the foundling is an emotional story about cruelty while the marquise of o is a romantic story that explores the limits of morality and honor finally the duel is an intense story about a deadly duel that tests the courage and loyalty of its characters kleist is known for being a master at creating engaging plots and complex characters this book is an excellent introduction to kleist s work and an essential bibliography for lovers of dramatic short stories
