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creating meaning is a new academic preparation book which integrates reading and writing students learn important reading strategies and the readings act as models and springboards for writing each chapter is built around a high interest topic that has an academic focus and will prepare the student for reading and writing in the academic world

examines the need for advanced levels of language learning from socio cultural and linguistic perspectives
