ranges around the question of scales of reasoning at the one extreme remote observation and the ability to interpret events and processes over vast reaches of time and space are possible because the analysis concerns the hoped for elucidation of general cultural processes at the other they are not as both analyst and subject are isolated in their own subjectivities analysts occupying the middle ground often advocate a multidimensional or holistic approach which involves multiple scales of analysis and interpretation as the battleground tends to be the degree to which specific datasets and analytical processes justify the interpretations put forth archaeologists rarely dress issues relating to the profound shifts in the scale of visualization necessary in all approaches to the past and why should they ignoring scale is the concession archaeology makes to interpretation
