amitav acharya has written a splendidly ambitious book travelling from the discipline of international relations to the historiography of southeast asia and back again it draws upon a range of methodologies to analyse the issue of identity in the configuration of southeast asia but it provides more than an academic assessment with this book acharya must be judged to have contributed not just to the study of southeast asian regionalism but to the process itself anthony milner basham professor of asian history australian national university

questions about the identity of southeast asia are implicitly questions about whether southeast asia is or can be a nation writ large for people who live in the region the answer is no the concept of southeast asia evolved from the need of europe america and japan to deal collectively with a set of territories and peoples that felt no particular identification with one another locating southeast asia

southeast asia whose alienation might tilt the balance of power in favor of the communist bloc has become the focus of american foreign policy amry

vandenbosch and richard butwell here trace the development of the eight nations which comprise southeast asia and appraise their current role in international affairs although led to adopt state forms similar to those of the departing colonial powers each nation traditionally had quite different political systems it is the authors thesis that their historical patterns of political and social behavior are re emerging and that the chief differences among the national political systems and related ways of life can largely be explained in these terms they feel that the main changes in southeast asia in the past two decades reflect the peculiar wedding of such historical considerations and the worldwide forces of democracy communism and economic development southeast asia the authors hold can be viewed as a single collective political entity for no country is free from direct or indirect influence from its neighbors and this interaction is increasing in quantity and intensity the pattern of political development the authors assert is much colored by national variations of common occurrences but paradoxically southeast asia has never meant more in terms of an interdependent unit historically than it does today

southeast asia with a total population of 520 million remains a region characterized by fragmentation diversity and considerable internal conflict despite the unifying influence of the association of southeast asian nations asean formed some thirty five years ago in the new millennium it has lost the distinction of being one of the worlds faster growing group of economies since the 1997 financial crisis while it has benefited from the winds of globalization it has now to cope with the painful adjustments to problems that stem from the inadequacies of good governance and structural changes
