with its real life stories and invitations for reflection and conversation this book is an ideal professional development resource for pre and in service birth age 3 professionals the author shares lived experiences of being in four distinctly different baby rooms as a researcher over extended periods of time she frames each life story around elements of well being and asks readers to consider whether and how environmental and relational factors supported or hindered the physical psychological and emotional well being of the children and adults the author encourages readers to see themselves in the stories to consider how they may have acted in the circumstances described and to deliberate on their own practices and beliefs with empathy and respect mcmullen fully conveys an intent to elevate celebrate and honor those who spend their days in infant toddler care and education while examining the critical role all adults in society play in the lives of our youngest citizens book features invites personal reflection and discussion with colleagues in the form of prompts and questions after each story provides a friendly but scholarly look at the spaces conditions and quality of birth to age three settings the area of fastest growing need in early childhood care and education ecce focuses on the well being of the adults and children featured in the book providing a holistic perspective on their needs motivations and experiences emphasizes a here and now perspective in contrast to books that tend to focus primarily on preparing children for future outcomes and accomplishments

the oxford handbook of infant toddler and preschool mental health assessment second edition brings together leading clinical and developmental researchers to provide empirically based recommendations for assessment of social emotional and behavior problems and disorders in the earliest years the second edition is fully updated and revised according to an upsurge of research in the field of assessment especially with regard to infants and children

this volume extends the knowledge base supporting research informed child care for infants and toddlers while simultaneously highlighting areas of study ripe for future research the authors demonstrate from a systems perspective that the experiences and outcomes of very young children in child care are influenced by characteristics of and interactions between the children adults and settings varying methodological approaches as well as the utilization of newer data collection instruments inform the field s understanding of current practices and procedures while offering guidance for future programming and policy in turn the chapters highlight a plethora of open questions and a need for a new generation of research to support the field of infant toddler care future challenges are evident in the recognition of the inadequate nature of our current measures of child outcomes and classroom processes the field s unmet promise to incorporate interdisciplinary perspectives and the need for newer methodological designs that blend the strengths of quantitative and

qualitative approaches these issues are important given the growing demand for infant toddler care and the increasing recognition of the unique role of this age period in serving as the foundation for all later development this book was originally published as a special issue of early education and development

this book conceptualizes the lived spaces of infant and toddler early education and care settings by bringing together international authors researching within diverse theoretical frameworks it highlights diverse ways of understanding the experiences of very young children by exposing the ways that the authors are grappling with the unknown the work explores broadly the construct and meanings of lived spaces as relational spaces interactional spaces transitional spaces curriculum spaces or pedagogical spaces operating within the social physical and temporal environment of infant toddler education settings the book invites interchange between and among diverse theories and approaches and through this build new understanding of infants and toddlers experiences and interactions in early education and care settings it also considers the implications of this work for policy and practice in infant and toddler education and care

this collection of essays brings to the north american audience the results of over 20 years of experience in the development of programs for infants and toddlers and their families in italy

learn how to create and nurture communities of care for diverse children families and practitioners through responsive practice in this text the social and emotional worlds of babies and toddlers their peers and their caregivers come to life in the everyday moments of infant toddler care and education the authors show infants and toddlers as active agentic and intentional social partners from the start of life highlighting their unique capacities for social engagement with both adults and peers interwoven within each chapter s narrative are insights culled from extensive observations teacher interviews and video analyses part i emphasizes play peer friendships and humor as essential elements of infant learning illustrated throughout with anecdotes of praxis in early care and education settings building on these aspects of babies ways of being in group care part ii examines the complex roles of infant toddler professionals and the critical importance of supportive and caring environments readers will explore the elements needed for in depth and specialized professional preparation including overarching principles of relationship based practice book features illuminates particular and understudied ways that infants and toddlers actively contribute to their own social learning and development shares how

teachers learn to engage with and nurture infants and toddlers social capacities and experiences within child care settings uses anecdotes and vignettes from the authors research and practice with infants toddlers and caregivers to bring their experiences to life discusses themes that are important and unique for infancy and toddlerhood such as play friendships humor and professional love presents a unique set of chapters that reveal infants and toddlers perspectives while also considering the caregiver s actions within a responsive care framework

robin lynn leavitt presents in a provocative ethnography the lived experiences of infants and toddlers in day care centers this text speaks to researchers and instructors interested in infancy early childhood socialization child care and interpretive research leavitt s original application of multiple theoretical perspectives interpretive interactionist critical feminist and postmodern yields powerful insights into the problematic emotional experiences and relations between infants and their caregivers the day care center is described as an institution that imposes a temporal and spatial regime on the lives of infants and toddlers vivid descriptions illustrate how caregivers create problematic situations for the children as they exercise unyielding power in the rigid management and control of the daily routines and play of children as leavitt documents the experiences of our youngest children she engages in a philosophical exploration of the meanings of emotionally responsive empowering care in group settings her analysis points to the need to care for caregivers and for caregiving to become a self reflective activity

this work provides an overview of cognitive intellectual personality and social development across the lifespan with attention to infancy early childhood middle childhood adolescence and early middle late adulthood chapters cover a broad range of core topics including language acquisition identity formation and the role of family peers

this report on european developments in infant and toddler care services was prepared to help define issues and options for the improvement and expansion of infant and toddler care and family support systems in the united states introductory comments suggest that advanced industrialized countries have almost unanimously elected universal but voluntary preschool for children for various stated purposes the report next focuses on six countries whose experiences are most relevant to the united states providing an overview of child care coverage and options administration costs educational philosophy staffing and family support services detailed profiles of specific schools programs or initiatives are also included highlighted findings include the following 1 denmark has the highest coverage of child care provision for children under age 3 in western europe combining center care and family day care of high quality 2 in france services for children under age 3 are under health auspices while its preschool program service for children aged 2 to 5 years is under education auspices and family support services are emerging out of this base as a universal program 3 italy has almost all of its 3 to 5 year olds enrolled in preschool but has only limited coverage for children under age 3 4 finland and sweden in systems covering all children to age 7 have pioneered parental at home options for infant care while also legislating a right to a guaranteed child care place and 5 england has the smallest proportion of very young children in out of home child care ac

this book shows care providers and educators how to turn everyday situations into opportunities for fostering children s language and communication skills providing appropriate guidance and discipline and using play to encourage children s learning case studies based on field experience help guide child care providers in their own relationships with children from birth to 6 years of age and extended interviews with child care professionals provide real world advice on facing the challenges of work while staying motivated

information on how warm and responsive care can help shape infants and toddlers development and their ability to learn can be reassuring for concerned parents this guide in english and spanish versions presents quality child care as a partnership between the child caregiver and the parents with the primary goal of benefiting the child the booklet describes procedures taken to ensure the child s safety in the child care setting including accident prevention procedures planning for emergencies and helping children become aware of safety the booklet also describes child care actions to prevent health problems such as health screening checking for good health

practices handling illnesses when they occur and teaching good health practices the booklet outlines what and how children learn and how caregivers teachers and parents can work together a section on learning through daily activities presents the types of everyday activities parents can expect in the child care setting including toy play art imitating and pretending stories and books tasting and preparing food sand and water play music and movement and outdoor play the booklet concludes with a list of curricular and parent resources kb
