using interviews with members of the congressional black caucus empirical data news accounts academic literature and case law

on obama examines some of the key philosophical questions that accompany the historic emergence of the 44th us president the purpose of this book is to take seriously the once common thought that the obama presidency had ushered in a post historical age three questions organize the argument of the book what s living and dead in the idea of post racialism did mr obama s preference for problem solving over ideological warfare mark him not just as a post partisan figure but as a philosophical pragmatist did the us become post imperial when the descendants of slaves and of british imperial subjects inhabited the white house in addition to taking up these questions the book considers mr obama s own relationship to the post historical idea and explores the ethical implications of certain ways of entertaining that idea

the united states has taken a long and winding road to racial equality especially as it pertains to relations between blacks and whites when barack hussein obama was elected as the forty fourth president of the united states and first black person to occupy the highest office in the land many wondered whether that road had finally come to an end do we now live in a post racial nation this volume contends that despite the election of the first black president and rise of a black american family as possibly the most recognized family the world over race is still a very salient issue particularly in the united states but the prominence of the obamas on the world stage and the positive image they project may hasten the day when america is indeed post racial even at the implicit level

the 2008 presidential election was celebrated around the world as a seminal moment in u s political and racial history white liberals and other progressives framed the election through the prism of change while previously acknowledged demographic changes were hastily heralded as the dawn of a post racial america however by 2011 much of the post election idealism had dissipated in the wake of an on going economic and financial crisis escalating wars in afghanistan and libya and the rise of the

united states during obama s presidency and how it might shape the country long after he leaves office

in a speech from which nation of cowards derives its title attorney general eric holder argued forcefully that americans today need to talk more not less about racism this appeal for candid talk about race exposes the paradox of barack obama s historic rise to the us presidency and the ever increasing social and economic instability of african american communities david h ikard and martell lee teasley maintain that such a conversation can take place only with passionate and organized pressure from black americans and that neither obama nor any political figure is likely to be in the forefront of addressing issues of racial inequality and injustice the authors caution blacks not to slip into an accommodating and self defeating post racial political posture settling for the symbolic capital of a black president instead of demanding structural change they urge the black community to challenge the social terms on which it copes with oppression including acts of self imposed victimization

edited by internationally recognised scholar femi ojo ade this volume brings together a mixture of young intellectuals and seasoned scholars from africa and its diaspora to address various implications of the obama phenomenon all from an afro oriented perspective far from being a neologism coined from what some would dismiss as obama s political jingoism the obama phenomenon change we can is an affirmation of potential power a call out to people of all races and cultures to work together for the just cause of human progress
