excerpt from landscape architecture a definition and a resume of its past and present there is at the present time much apparent misunderstanding of the terms landscape architecture and landscape gardening it is not unusual to hear it stated that this calling a man a landscape architect instead of a landscape gardener is merely a fad filling one's mind with images of quarries stone cutters creaking derricks tapping trowels and the like instead of with pictures of free hand dealings with sunshine and shadow trees flowering shrubs and leaping fountains one well known writer has even gone so far as to state that the men most deeply engaged in the art have not decided what to call it and that it is suspected that the present fashion among the professional brethren of calling themselves landscape architects is promoted by two accidental causes first the
