on december 16 1944 hitler launched his last desperate offensive of world war ii it was his final great gamble and later became known as the battle of the bulge

the focus on the 1944 ardennes offensive is always on the initial dash of kampfguppe peiper and the battles around bastogne the tanks steal the show most german forces involved were however infantry divisions with little means of transport they are often regarded as the weak link the footsloggers who could not catch up with the tanks there was however an often overlooked german infantry success in the schneiffel sector the german 18th volksgrenadierdivision almost singlehandedly defeated the american 106th infantry division in the historiography this is often either glossed over or grossly exaggerated why because an inferior german force in terms of infantry artillery and armour defeated a larger better trained american force this book explains how a german volksgrenadierdivision was shaped up for battle and which role its general played in the eventual success it also highlights the crucial role of a dozen assault guns an unassuming tracked vehicle in the german attack the american side is not forgotten and gets a thorough analysis on often overlooked aspects like the integration of replacements and the problems of command r a b bruijns is a military historian with a focus on the first and second world war he also runs the youtube channel armies and battles

this study investigates the role that logistics played in the failure of the german offensive in the ardennes in 1944 the thesis explains that despite the incredible build up of forces and supplies the inability of the german strategic and operational logistics systems to properly equip fuel arm and move forces caused the failure of the ardennes offensive the concept of this thesis starts with the overall strategic military and political situation of germany in the fall of 1944 that hitler used to base his decision to conduct the offensive

in december 1944 the study then examines in detail the strategic capabilities during the build up of supplies and the operational level organization and planning for the offensive an analysis of the details on the impact of terrain climate allied air interdiction and operation point blank is included in this chapter then it examines the first weeks of the offensive and looks at the failure of the fuel and arm and move tactical logistics functions an analysis of the impact of logistics on supporting operations is included in this chapter

german army deficiencies are often cited as the reason for the failure of the german counteroffensive in the ardennes region of france belgium and luxembourg in december of 1944 to january 1945 which the germans called operation wacht am rhein the allies named the ardennes counteroffensive and was also commonly known as the battle of the bulge it is certainly true that the three german armies regrouped for the offensive were in differing states only the 5th panzer army was in something resembling good condition with the 6th and the 7th mediocre at best the divisions were also often not mobile enough because of the lack of automotive equipment and were short on tanks and artillery but these cannot be considered the only reasons for the german failure it was also the speed of the allied reaction and especially the conduct of the americans who experienced some of the fiercest combat of the war and suffered over 100 000 casualties this volume in the casemate illustrated series with over 100 photographs and 24 color profiles describes in detail the different events that caused the german defeat from the beginning of the offensive on december 16 1944 to the retreat behind the siegfried line it looks at several topics in particular the american resistance at st vith the resistance of the 101st airborne in bastogne german obstinacy in persisting with the siege at bastogne the airlift and the intervention of the 9th us air force the rapid regrouping of the 3rd us army patton s counterattack the british counterattack and finally how the allies failed to transform the german withdrawal into rout missing an opportunity to cross the siegfried line and the rhine on the heels of the germans leading to an incomplete victory

bastogne december 20th 1944 after the successful amphibious invasion on d day in june 1944 the allies began racing east toward germany and liberating france along the way the allies had landed along a 50 mile stretch of french coast and despite suffering 8 000 casualties on d day over 100 000 still began the march across the western portion of the continent by the end of august 1944 the german army in france was shattered with 200 000 killed or wounded and a further 200 000 captured however adolf hitler reacted to the news of invasion with glee figuring it would give the germans a chance to destroy the allied armies that had water to their backs as he put it the news couldn t be better we have them where we can destroy them while that sounds delusional in retrospect it was hitler s belief that by splitting the allied march across europe in their drive toward germany he could cause the collapse of the enemy armies and cut off their supply lines part of hitler s confidence came as a result of underestimating american resolve but with the soviets racing toward berlin from the east this final offensive would truly be the last gasp of the german war machine and the month long campaign was fought over a large area of the ardennes forest through france belgium and parts of luxembourg from an allied point of view the operations were commonly referred to as the ardennes offensive while the german code phrase for the operation was unternehmen wacht am rhein operation watch on the rhine with the initial breakout going under the name of operation mist today americans know it best as the battle of the bulge bastogne would become a legendary linchpin in the defense against the ardennes offensive in part for its strategic importance but also because of the almost superhuman effort made to protect it seven important roads converged with the town of bastogne and the germans on their way to antwerp recognized its importance as a hub but with the weather obscuring the military map and intelligence at an unusually low rate of abundance or reliability no americans on the ground from private to general knew precisely what was about to happen or in what way it would manifest itself three officers colonel s l a marshall captain john g westover and lieutenant a joseph webber collaborated to put it quite succinctly in the washington infantry journal when they described bastogne as a series of small dramatic military

actions related more by circumstances beyond the control of the defensive forces involved than by the design of a single commander in an astonishing feat of planning logistics and discipline patton's army redirected 133 000 vehicles 62 000 tons of supplies and the vehicles and men covered a combined distance of 1 5 million miles to his superiors amazement patton was poised to reach bastogne and attack the germans on december 22 and on december 21 he told bradley brad this time the kraut's stuck his head in the meat grinder and i've got hold of the handle of course for patton's third army to relieve the siege the men had to hold out a few days which they were able to do because supplies were parachuted in and the germans eschewed frontal assaults in the end patton's army reached bastogne in 4 days and lifted the siege even he used superlatives to describe the action at bastogne calling it the most brilliant operation we have thus far performed and it is in my opinion the outstanding achievement of the war this is my biggest battle
