psychology s study of women has revealed some themes that span
cultures and countries yet women s lived experiences in different cultures
can be dramatically different this element explores from a psychological
perspective women s issues in cultural contexts beginning with the
question of public and private identity i e who counts as a woman it goes
on to examine embodiment sexuality reproduction family roles economic
participation and power violence leadership and feminist activism it
concludes with a brief discussion of women s complicated relationship to
culture as both keepers and sometimes prisoners of cultural traditions
particularly in the context of migration to different cultures running through

targeted at women in the postwar period foregrounds the diversity and the significance of print cultures for women in the postwar period across periodicals fiction and other printed matter examines changes and continuities as women's magazines have moved into digital format highlights the important cultural and political contexts of women's periodicals including the women's liberation movement and socialism explores the significance of women as publishers printers and editors women's periodicals and print culture in Britain 1940s 2000s draws attention to the wide range of postwar print cultures for women the collection spans domestic cultural and feminist magazines and extends to ephemera novels and other printed matter as well as digital magazine formats the range of essays indicates both the history of publishing for women and the diversity of readers and audiences over the mid late twentieth century and the early twenty first century in Britain the collection reflects in detail the important ways in which magazines and printed matter contributed to challenged or informed British women's culture a range of approaches including interview textual analysis and industry commentary are employed in order to demonstrate the variety of ways in which the impact of postwar print media may be understood

to the 1993 un human development report there is no country in the world in which women s quality of life is equal to that of men this examination of women s quality of life thus addresses questions which have a particular urgency it aims to describe the basic situation of all women and so develops a universal account that can answer the charges of western imperialism frequently made against such accounts the contributors confront the issue of cultural relativism criticizing the relativist approach which in its desire to respect different cultural traditions can result in indifference to injustice an account of gender justice and women s equality is then proposed in various areas in which quality of life is measured these issues are related throughout to the specific contexts of india bangladesh china mexico and nigeria through a series of case studies disciplines represented include philosophy economics political science anthropology law and sociology like its predecessor the quality of life this volume encourages the reader to think critically about the central fundamental concepts used in development economics and suggests major criticisms of current economic approaches from that fundamental viewpoint contributors martha nussbaum marty chen susan wolf jonathan glover onora o neill david crocker hilary putnam linda alcoff amartya sen susan moller okin ruth anna putnam cass r sunstein christine m korsgaard catherine lutz xiaorong li margarita m valdes nkiru nzegwu

this text expands the agenda of feminist international relations by considering the heterogeneity of women s voices in the realm of world politics as well as the challenges that this diversity poses the authors develop a theoretical discourse that incorporates the combined notion of difference and emancipation in a discussion of the agency of women and their transformative capacity they use a normative approach to understanding the multiple subjectivities of women and the plurality of their experiences

the 1980s witnessed the ascendancy of russian women in multiple spheres of artistic creation including literature film and painting this volume may

thus be said to engage not only women's artistic production but indeed the best and most colourful of recent Russian culture treating contemporary Russian women's creativity it approaches women's texts films and canvasses from a range of perspectives from anti-gendered to feminist some of the essays introduce writers not previously well studied others challenge conventional interpretations and assumptions while still others yield original viewpoints through novel juxtapositions in addition to offering insights into the various artists under analysis the essays map the wide terrain of issues and methodologies proliferating in cultural criticism today and mirror the diversity that is one of the most appealing features of women's creativity in contemporary Russia

until recently women have been noticeably absent from historical and sociological accounts of modernity as a step toward remedying this situation the essays gathered here challenge the continuing separation of sociological from textual analysis in cultural and feminist theory and inquiry they address critically the question of women's writing exploring the idea that women may begin to define their own lives and construct their own identities in a patriarchal culture through the very process of writing they also present a cogent defense of a feminist cultural politics including a politics of the body integrating material drawn from a variety of sources feminist theory cultural and literary analysis sociology and art history feminine sentences is an original discussion of women's relationship to modern and postmodern culture Janet Wolff's book represents a major statement of her distinctive position and will be of interest to everyone working in the areas of cultural and literary theory women's studies and sociology from the book women are sentenced to containment and silence this collection is intended as a contribution to the overthrow of that sentence and to the process whereby women find ways to intervene in an excluding culture and to articulate their own experience feminine sentences are those formulations and expressions in a variety of cultural forms and media of women's own voice the literature of modernity describes the experience of men it is essentially a literature about
