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this insightful handbook brings together leading and emerging scholars within the field of nonprofit organization serving as a call to action for academics to interrogate key contemporary issues such as backsliding and authoritarianism it meticulously distinguishes traditional often marginalist perspectives from nuanced counterarguments to balance out the field

this book explores key policy issues related to early childhood education through the contributions of various professionals in the field the editors provide a vision practical and possible of early childhood education in the 1990s part i delves into the complex world both personal and professional of the classroom teacher the essays in part ii look at issues of the school community including the roles of class race gender and exceptionality finally part iii examines the relationship between schools and the community at large and how complex issues find their way into social and economic policies that often stifle rather than support the democratic vision of american schools taken as a whole the volume presents a stimulating discussion of the current state of early childhood education policy and practice

the use of critical and post structural theories such as critical race theory intersectionality and queer theory to explore student development is relatively new most current research looks beyond the individual to how systems of oppression such as racism ableism and heterosexism mediate student development and the nature of student development theory this volume offers some of the most contemporary thinking about student development by reviewing recent critical post structural scholarship offering new possibilities for using theoretical lenses and translating these theories into student affairs practice this is the 154th volume of this jossey bass higher education quarterly series an indispensable resource for vice presidents of student affairs deans of students student counselors and other student services professionals new directions for student services offers guidelines and programs for aiding students in their total development emotional social physical and intellectual

renewable energy is one of the fastest growing sectors in the global economy as climate scientists and environmentalists give voice to the detrimental

effects of fossil fuels but how far have we gotten in developing efficient and sustainable energy including solar wind and geothermal power and what are the benefits of these renewable energy sources compared to fossil fuels this text examines the issue from diverse viewpoints allowing students to analyze key ideas in energy production through primary source evidence

strong states and strong civil societies are now increasingly hailed as the twin drivers of a rising africa current attempts to support growth and democracy are part of a longer history of promoting projects of disciplinary regulatory and liberal rule and values beyond the west yet this is not simply western domination of a passive continent such an interpretation misses out on the complexities and nuances of the politics of state building and civil society promotion and the central role of african agency drawing upon critical theory including postcolonial and governmentality approaches this book interrogates international practices of state building and civil society support in africa it seeks to develop a theoretically informed critical approach to discourses and interventions such as those associated with broadly western initiatives in africa in doing so the book highlights the power relations inequalities coercion and violence that are deeply implicated within contemporary international interventions on the african continent providing a range of empirical cases and theoretical approaches the chapters are united by their critical treatment of political dynamics in africa this book will be of interest to students and scholars of african politics development studies postcolonial theory international relations international political economy and peacekeeping making

the past few years mark a growing scholarly interest in african children s literature in the united states several books have recently been published on

the subject and the number of papers on african children s literature presented at conferences or published in scholarly journals also seems to have increased these publications are becoming more and more sophisticated as scholars move away from general country surveys or analyses of publishing conditions and instead analyze literary structures themes and illustrations or apply marxist feminist or postcolonial theories to interpret literary works the question of an authentic voice in postcolonial african children s literature has emerged as a central concern to those who care about books for african children and young adults also of importance is the matter of how africa is presented in literature for children who do not live on that continent the essays in this book either take a postcolonial or revisionist approach to the study of colonial literature or discuss books published after decolonization the introductory essay provides a general analysis of the key issues facing the publication of children s books in postcolonial africa issues of national identity language appropriate genres and relevant themes to inculcate a nationalistic outlook in children and young adults the chapters that follow are located within this broad framework and are written by expert contributors while these essays reflect the scholarly interests and specialization of each author they also span the entire field of african children s literature the first group of chapters surveys african children s literature from a variety of angles and explores such topics as literacy and the publishing culture in africa the role and importance of awards nigerian young adult literature and the relevance of folktales the book then turns to a discussion of books about africa written by western authors for western readers which often project values and perspectives that betray a continuing colonial bias the last part of the book examines more specialized themes and concerns

the language of leadership without at the same time assuming its essentially positive intrinsically affirmative nature within organizations routinely referring to bosses as leaders has therefore become both a symptom and a cause of a deep largely unexamined new conceptual architecture this architecture underpins how we think about authority and power at work capitalism and its turbo charged offspring neo liberalism have effectively captured leader and leadership to serve their own purposes in other words organizational leadership today is so often a particular kind of insidious conservatism dressed up in radical adjectives this book makes visible the work that the language of leadership does in perpetuating fictions that are useful for bosses of work organizations we do this so that we and anyone who shares similar discomforts can make a start in unravelling the fiction we contend that even if our views are contrary to the vast and powerful leadership industry our basic arguments rest on things that are plain and evident for all to see critical perspectives on leadership the language of corporate power will be key reading for students academics and practitioners in the disciplines of leadership organizational studies critical management studies sociology and the related disciplines

the legendary greek figure orpheus was said to have possessed magical powers capable of moving all living and inanimate things through the sound of his lyre and voice over time the orphic theme has come to indicate the power of music to unsettle subvert and ultimately bring down oppressive realities in order to liberate the soul and expand human life without limits the liberating effect of music has been a particularly important theme in twentieth century african american literature the nine original essays in black orpheus examines the orphic theme in the fiction of such african american writers as jean toomer langston hughes claud mckay james baldwin nathaniel mackey sherley anne williams ann petry ntozake shange alice walker gayl jones and toni morrison the authors discussed in this volume depict music as a mystical shamanistic and spiritual power that can miraculously transform the realities of the soul and of the world here the musician uses his or her music as a weapon to shield and protect his or her spirituality written by scholars of english music women s studies american studies cultural theory and black and africana studies the essays in this interdisciplinary collection ultimately explore the thematic linguistic structural presence of music in twentieth century african american fiction

rhys acclaimed author of wide sargasso sea quartet and other novels treating the alienation of a woman from the caribbean living in european

settings has been a focus of interest both as a feminist writer and in the context of caribbean literature
