how popular films from memento to slumdog millionaire can help us understand how memory works in the movie slumdog millionaire the childhood memories of a young game show contestant trigger his correct answers in memento the amnesiac hero uses tattoos as memory aids in away from her an older woman suffering from dementia no longer remembers who her husband is these are compelling films that tell affecting stories about the human condition but what can these movies teach us about memory in this book john seamon shows how examining the treatment of memory in popular movies can shed new light on how human memory works after explaining that memory is actually a diverse collection of independent systems seamon uses examples from movies to offer an accessible nontechnical description of what science knows about memory function and dysfunction in a series of lively encounters with numerous popular films he draws on life of pi and avatar for example to explain working memory used for short term retention he describes the process of long term memory with examples from such films as cast away and groundhog day the return of martin guerre among other movies informs his account of how we recognize people the effect of emotion on autobiographical memory is illustrated by the kite runner titanic and other films movies including born on the fourth of july and rachel getting married illustrate the complex pain of traumatic memories seamon shows us that movies rarely get amnesia right often using strategically timed blows to the protagonist's head as a way to turn memory off and then on again as in desperately seeking susan finally he

uses movies including on golden pond and amour to describe the memory loss that often accompanies aging while highlighting effective ways to maintain memory function

every large nation in the world was directly or indirectly affected by the impact of war during the course of the twentieth century and while the historical narratives of war of these nations are well known far less is understood about how small islands coped these islands often not nations in their own right but small outposts of other kingdoms countries and nations have been relegated to mere footnotes in history and heritage studies as interesting case studies or unimportant curiosities yet for many of these small islands war had an enduring impact on their history memory intangible heritage and future cultural practices leaving a legacy that demanded some form of local response this is the first comprehensive volume dedicated to what the memories legacies and heritage of war in small islands can teach those who live outside them through closely related historical and contemporary case studies covering 20th and 21st century conflict across the globe the volume investigates a number of important questions why and how is war memory so enduring in small islands do factors such as population size island size isolation or geography have any impact do close ties of kinship and group identity enable collective memories to shape identity and its resulting war related heritage this book contributes to heritage and memory studies and to conflict and historical archaeology by providing a globally wide ranging comparative assessment of small islands and their experiences of war heritage of war in small island territories is of relevance to students researchers heritage and tourism professionals local governments and ngos

francie cate s popular memory and franco s disappeared is an obra magistral an opus magnum a masterwork it is an in depth and broad study in which further research on memory imposed forgetting counter memory and the dynamics of cultural memory will be rooted maureen tobin stanley university of minnesota duluth usa this book examines a people s history of the spanish civil war s anti fascists who lost their 1936 1939 fight against far right military insurgents the book argues that the regime s disappeared have in fact since 1936 been the most visible protagonists safeguarded in the shared collective memory of the war s losers narratives about franco s up to 150 000 civilian shooting victims stories told in the form of memoirs political speeches visual art film novels and oral testimonies form the centerpiece of this study how have these narratives told by the war s losers focused explicitly on the figure of the dead body been mobilized in periods of political upheaval from 1936 to the present including wwii the 1950s and 60s of the cold war the 1970s and 80s spanish transition ongoing mass media culture wars that have polarized the right and the left since public exhumations of unmarked graves began in

the year 2000 through fieldwork in the province of cádiz the author has also recorded interviews with family members of citizens who were murdered through oral narratives an entire community violently punished during the years of the dictatorship succeeded in keeping alive an alternative history of the pre war enterprise to establish the 1931 spanish democratic republic and to build a modern nation bound by constitutional law the discursive commonalities identified in the wide ranging testimonies including pioneering researchers publications beginning in the 1970s constitute a fascinating textual topography of popular cultural memory this book argues that this treasure trove of storytelling preserved an initially clandestine counter narrative of anti francoist resistance as well as dreams of justice for the dead

a collection of works by asian scholars looking at different ways in which relatively recent traumas have been memorialized in their various countries often while the traumas themselves are ongoing or the memories of them contested memory studies typically focuses on the study of memorialization after traumatic incidents are overcome in asia however the past and the present remain closely intertwined between the legacies of the japanese empire the respective suppressions by the kuomintang and the people s republic of china and the ongoing protests in much of southeast asia against oppressive governments and laws memorialization is occurring while the histories are still being contested the contributors to this book are asian scholars examining the memorializing of events in the countries of asia including china taiwan japan korea thailand and the philippines using local language sources they look at a broad range of media of memorialization encompassing statues cemeteries testimonial literature and film among others an insightful resource for scholars of memory and cultural studies as well as those of twentieth and twenty first century asian history

narratives of contemporary spanish writer soledad puértolas 1947 inducted into the real

academia española in 2010 depict the psychological struggles of the individual in postmodern democratic european society puértolas s realist style emphasizes storytelling and character portrayal and her urban middle class characters seek satisfying interactions with others and a sense of purpose memory aids characters in their quest for meaning and identity and their use of memory reveals their self perception and outlook on life this book maps four ways in which puértolas s narratives use memory to approach the fundamental problem of the individual s search for purpose and identity some characters are burdened by memory in certain texts especially días del arenal 1992 and burdeos 1986 reflection upon a painful self defining memory affects their present mood and behavior for some this burden causes them to withdraw or to act irresponsibly others accept and overcome the scars of the past a second type of character takes an escapist approach to memory as seen in queda la noche 1989 their nostalgic retreat indicates a restless dissatisfaction with the present in a third type of memory a secondary character provides the organizing force behind a protagonist s reminiscences often an extroverted foil to highlight the protagonist s introspective nature memory of the relationship motivates the protagonist to mentally order his or her own life through the life review process una vida inesperada 1997 and la señoora berg 1998 provide examples finally in the amnesic mode puértolas departs from realism to experiment with different forms of amnesia as in la rosa de plata 1999 and si al atardecer llegara el mensajero 1995 memory loss highlights the centrality of memory to personhood and identity while at the same time it draws attention to the inadequacy of memory to explain the totality of existence

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
