Justification and Accountability Audi underscores the need for justifying ethical choices Organizations and individuals should be able to articulate the moral principles underlying 2 their actions and be accountable for their consequences Transparency and clear communication regarding ethical standards are critical elements This resembles a court of law where actions must be justifiable based on established principles

Practical Applications Navigating Ethical Dilemmas Applying Audis framework involves a multistep process

- 1 Identify the Ethical Issue Clearly define the moral problem at hand What values are at stake Who are the stakeholders affected
- 2 Gather Relevant Information Collect all pertinent
