reduced regulatory scrutiny and potential government incentives and conclude that sustainable practices are ultimately more profitable

**Whistleblowing** An employee facing an ethical dilemma might weigh the personal risks eg job loss retaliation against the potential benefits eg preventing harm upholding their moral principles potential legal protection The decision to blow the whistle depends on the individuals assessment of these costs and benefits

**Limitations of the Rational Choice Approach** While powerful the rational choice framework isnt without its limitations

**Bounded rationality** In reality individuals and organizations often lack the cognitive capacity or information to make fully rational decisions Time constraints incomplete information and emotional biases all limit our ability to perfectly assess costs and benefits
