allegedly reviewed what were the qualifications of the members of the nrp did the panel ask the right questions were the views represented on the panel sufficiently inclusive did the nrp satisfy the congressional mandate to ensure that all children learn to read without coles thorough critique of this scientific foundation for reading legislation the media will continue to portray the nrp report as gospel the public particularly teachers policy makers and parents will have inadequate information for making informed instructional decisions and federal state and local advocates of beginning reading instruction with a skills emphasis will have little opposition in achieving their objectives
