in the return of the real hal foster discusses the development of art and theory since 1960 and reorders the relation between prewar and postwar avant gardes opposed to the assumption that contemporary art is somehow belated he argues that the avant garde returns to us from the future repositioned by innovative practice in the present and he poses this retroactive model of art and theory against the reactionary undoing of progressive culture that is pervasive today after the models of art as text in the 1970s and art as simulacrum in the 1980s foster suggests that we are now witness to a

return to the real to art and theory grounded in the materiality of actual bodies and social sites if the return of the real begins with a new narrative of the historical avant-garde it concludes with an original reading of this contemporary situation and what it portends for future practices of art and theory culture and politics

in the first comprehensive biography of hal foster author brian m kane examines the 70 year career of one of the greatest illustrators of the twentieth century superman was modeled after foster's drawings of tarzan flash gordon's alex raymond borrowed compositions from prince valiant and thousands of artists including the famous contemporary western painter james bama count foster among their greatest influences

in these diatribes on the marketing of culture and the branding of identity the development of spectacle architecture and the rise of global cities hal foster surveys our new political economy of design written in a lively style design and crime explores the historical relations of modern art and modern museum the conceptual vicissitudes of art history and visual studies the recent travails of art criticism and the double aftermath of modernism and postmodernism in an attempt to illuminate the conditions for critical culture in the present

who branded painting in the pop age more brazenly than richard hamilton roy lichtenstein andy warhol gerhard richter and ed ruscha and who probed the pop revolution in image and identity more intensely than they this book presents an interpretation of pop art through the work of these pop five

bad new days examines the evolution of art and criticism in western europe and north america over the last twenty five years exploring their dynamic relation to the general condition of emergency instilled by neoliberalism and the war on terror considering the work of artists such as thomas hirschhorn tacita dean and isa genzken and the writing of thinkers like jacques rancière bruno latour and giorgio agamben hal foster shows the ways in which art has anticipated this condition at times resisting the collapse of the social contract or gesturing toward its repair at other times burlesquing it against the claim that art making has become so heterogeneous as to defy historical analysis foster argues that the critic must still articulate a clear account of the contemporary in all its complexity to that end he offers several paradigms for the art of recent years which he terms abject archival mimetic and precarious

surveying the artistic and cultural scene in the era of trump in a world where truth is

cast in doubt and shame has gone missing what are artists and critics on the left to do how to demystify a political order that laughs away its own contradictions how to mock leaders who thrive on the absurd and why in any event offer more outrage to a media economy that feeds on the same such questions are grist to the mill of hal foster who in what comes after farce delves into recent developments in art criticism and fiction under the current regime of war surveillance extreme inequality and media disruption concerned first with the cultural politics of emergency since 9 11 including the use and abuse of trauma conspiracy and kitsch he moves on to consider the neoliberal makeover of aesthetic forms and art institutions during the same period a final section surveys signal transformations in art film and writing among the phenomena explored are machine vision images produced by machines for other machines without a human interface operational images images that do not represent the world so much as intervene in it and the algorithmic scripting of information that pervades our everyday lives if all this sounds dire it is in many respects we look out on a world that has moved not only politically but also technologically beyond our control yet foster also sees possibility in the current debacle the possibility to pressure the cracks in this order to turn emergency into change

artists art historians and critics look at the legacies of feminism and critical theory in the work of women artists more than thirty years after the beginning of the modern women's movement and linda nochlin's landmark essay why have there been no great women artists more than thirty years after the birth of the modern women's movement and the beginnings of feminist art making and art history the time is ripe to examine the legacies of those revolutions in women artists at the millennium artists art historians and critics examine the differences that feminist art practice and critical theory have made in late twentieth century art and the discourses surrounding it in 1971 when linda nochlin published her essay why have there been no great women artists in a special issue of art news there were no women's studies no feminist theory no such thing as feminist art criticism there was instead a focus on the mythic figure of the great male artist through history since then the woman artist has not simply been assimilated into the canon of greatness but has expanded art making into a multiplicity of practices with new parameters and perspectives in women artists at the millennium artists including martha rosler and yvonne rainer reflect upon their own varied practices and art historians discuss the innovative work of such figures as louise bourgeois lygia clark mona hatoum and carrie mae weems and linda nochlin considers changes since her landmark essay and looks to the future writing we will need all our wit and courage to make sure that women's voices are heard their work seen and
