sustainable resource use for production and livelihoods inclusive responsibility also places importance on quality of life pluralism equity and justice for all and emphasises the health well being sovereignty dignity and rights of producers consumers and other stakeholders as well as of nonhuman animals and the natural world explores some of the key drivers and root causes of unsustainability degradation of the agricultural environment and destruction of nature highlights the many ways that different stakeholders have been forging new ways forward towards alternative paradigms of agriculture human nutrition and political economy which are more sustainable and just proposes ways to move beyond the current unsustainable exploitation of natural resources towards agroecological sustainability and overall sustainability of the food and agriculture system based on inclusive responsibility

the food and agriculture organization fao of the united nations presents the full text of the state of food and agriculture 2000 the report discusses topics such as the current agricultural situation the overall world economic environment and agriculture microcredit lessons from the past 50 years on world food and agriculture and political economy in the alleviation of poverty and food insecurity among others

the state of the world s biodiversity for food and agriculture presents the first global assessment of biodiversity for food and agriculture worldwide biodiversity for food and agriculture is the diversity of plants animals and micro organisms at genetic species and ecosystem levels present in and around crop livestock forest and aquatic production systems it is essential to the structure functions and processes of these systems to livelihoods and food security and to the supply of a wide range of ecosystem services it has been managed or influenced by farmers livestock keepers forest dwellers fish farmers and fisherfolk for hundreds of

generations prepared through a participatory country driven process the report draws on information from 91 country reports to provide a description of the roles and importance of biodiversity for food and agriculture the drivers of change affecting it and its current status and trends it describes the state of efforts to promote the sustainable use and conservation of biodiversity for food and agriculture including through the development of supporting policies legal frameworks institutions and capacities it concludes with a discussion of needs and challenges in the future management of biodiversity for food and agriculture the report complements other global assessments prepared under the auspices of the commission on genetic resources for food and agriculture which have focused on the state of genetic resources within particular sectors of food and agriculture

governments have turned to fao for support in identifying and assessing options for reforming policies on food and agriculture through the monitoring and analysing food and agricultural policies mafap programme while the first phase of fao s efforts concentrated more on conducting policy analysis and measuring public expenditures this second phase built on the first phase s outcomes to support policy reforms across southern asia and sub saharan africa mafap has been found to be an effective and well positioned influencer of policy reforms in the agricultural sector however there are areas of improvement for this programme including i increased resources to better address increasing policy support demand ii more strategic planning iii more formal institutionalization and more engagement with civil society and the private sector iv more coherence at country level in conducting preliminary analysis and v improvement to its knowledge management system in order not to lose its institutional memory

the city region food systems crfs programme is a global initiative of fao and ruaf that aims to support national and local governments and local food actors to build resilient city region food systems by strengthening rural urban linkages and improving the resilience to

the aim of this new publication is to present in one volume a comprehensive review of recent national and international policy changes relevant to basic food commodity markets this issue of the review of basic food policies covers developments in production consumption marketing and trade policies for cereals oilcrops and meats it is hoped that the information provided will be of use to policy makers and others concerned with the broader issue of agricultural development and food security

forests have the potential to contribute to food security and nutrition in a number of ways they are a source of food and they provide woodfuel for cooking income employment and ecosystem services that are essential to support agricultural and fishery production despite this potential most often the existing forestry policies are focused on economic efficiency and do not consider the relevance of forests to sustainable food security and nutrition conversion of forests to other land uses for example is usually justified on an economic basis with insufficient attention to the long term environmental and livelihood impacts on local people this forestry guidance note leads policymakers to realize the potential for forestry policies to support the food security and nutrition of
