South Carolina Mississippi Florida Alabama Georgia Louisiana and Texas They formed the Confederate States of America with Jefferson Davis as president Fort Sumter The first shots of the war were fired on April 12 1861 when Confederate forces bombarded Fort Sumter in Charleston Harbor South Carolina This event ignited a wave of nationalism in both the North and South quickly leading to the turning point as it resulted in the Unions first major victory and prompted Lincoln to issue the Emancipation Proclamation The Emancipation Proclamation Issued by President Lincoln in January 1863 the Emancipation Proclamation declared that all slaves in Confederateheld territory were to be freed It had significant ramifications transforming the war into a fight for freedom and equality The Siege of Vicksburg A key Union victory in 1863 the capture of Vicksburg Mississippi gave the Union control of the Mississippi River effectively splitting the Confederacy in two The Battle of Gettysburg A
