Herbert Hoover President during the beginning of the Great Depression Hoovers policies were widely criticized as ineffective in dealing with the crisis Franklin D Roosevelt Elected president in 1932 Roosevelts New Deal programs aimed to provide relief recovery and reform fundamentally reshaping the role of the federal government in American society
