technology education practice part i has eight stories told by teachers topics range from puppet making to electronics and biotechnology the teachers were nominated by academic technology education experts part ii has eleven essays by such experts in which they identify those elements in the teachers accounts that they consider to be justifications for calling that practice good focuses in these essays are technological literacy ethics culture design stakeholders attitudes motivation teaching approaches social aspects differentiation and assessment for technology education the first book that is based on reflection on successful practice as an approach for developing research insights for this curricular domain

the sociology of religion has had several frameworks guiding its analysis including functionalism interpretive sociology phenomenology symbolic interactionism and now rational choice theory marxism has tended to ignore religion assuming it is something that would eventually disappear even though it retained theological elements this collection of essays brings together a group of scholars who use frameworks provided by marx and critical theory in analyzing religion it s goal is to establish a critical theory of religion within the sociology of religion as an alternative to rational choice in doing so it engages in a critique of the positivism uncritical praise of the market neoconservatism and one dimensional conception of rationality of the rational choice theory of religion
