Use a semicolon when both clauses are independent and closely related but not directly explained by

colon Generally no A colon should follow an independent clause However there might be rare stylistic

exceptions but they are uncommon and should be used with caution 5 Can a semicolon be used to

connect three or more independent clauses While technically possible its generally considered better

style to break up a long series of independent clauses into shorter sentences for better readability

Overusing semicolons can make your writing appear choppy and less clear 4
