interiors now found themselves at the forefront of developing trades with the promise of wealth and power european women and men whose prospects were circumscribed at home saw potential in emigration economic aspirations beckoned large numbers but also in the maelstrom following the reformation others sought the chance to worship as they saw fit many saw their hopes dashed but some succeeded as they had desired ultimately as people of african and european descent came to predominate in american populations they broke political ties to europe and reshaped transatlantic relationships
