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in many senses viewers have cut their teeth on the violence in american cinema from anthony perkins slashing janet leigh in the most infamous of shower scenes to the 1970s masterpieces of martin scorsese sam peckinpah and francis ford coppola to our present day undertakings in imagining global annihilations through terrorism war and alien grudges transfigurations brings our cultural obsession with film violence into a renewed dialogue with contemporary theory grønstad argues that the use of violence in hollywood films should be understood semiotically rather than viewed

realistically tranfigurations thus alters both our methodology of reading violence in films and the meanings we assign to them depicting violence not as a self contained incident but as a convoluted network of our own cultural ideologies and beliefs

since the development of film as an artistic medium in the 1890s there has been an inherent tension between still photographic images and moving cinematic images from their form and function to the messages they convey and their impact on the beholder and on culture at large this volume one of the first book length works to analyze critique and further the international debate about the meaning and use of motion and stillness in film and photography takes these concepts out of the theoretical arena of cinematic studies and applies them to the wider and ever changing landscape of images and media with contributions from such acclaimed international scholars as tom gunning thomas elsaesser mark b n hansen george baker ina blom and christa blümlinger these collected essays examine the strategic uses of stillness and motion in art from the mid nineteenth century to the technologically driven present

alexander kluge is best known as a founding member of the new german cinema his work however spans a diverse range of fields and over the last fifty years he has been active as a filmmaker writer and television producer this work features scholarly essays plus articles stories and interviews involving kluge from back cover

dogma 95 the avant garde filmmaking movement founded by the danish director lars von trier and three of his fellow directors was launched in 1995 at an elite cinema conference in paris when von trier was called upon to speak about the future of film but instead showered the audience with pamphlets announcing the new movement and its manifesto a refreshingly original critical commentary on the director and his practice playing the waves is a paramount addition to one of new media s most provocative genres games and gaming playing the waves cleverly puns on the title of one of von trier s most famous features and argues that dogma 95 like much of the director s low budget realist productions is a game that takes cinema beyond the traditional confines of film aesthetics and dramatic rules simons articulates the ways in which von trier redefines the practice of filmmaking as a rule bound activity and stipulates the forms and structures of games von trier brings to bear on his films as well as the sobering lessons he draws from economic and evolutionary game theory much like the director s films this fascinating volume takes the traditional point of view of film theory and film aesthetics to the next level and demonstrates we have much to learn from the perspective of game studies and game theory

twenty years ago noted film scholars tom gunning and andré gaudreault introduced the phrase cinema of attractions to describe the essential qualities of films made in the medium s earliest days those produced between 1895 and 1906 now the cinema of attractions reloaded critically examines the term and its subsequent wide ranging use in film studies the collection opens with a history of the term tracing the collaboration between gaudreault and gunning the genesis of the term in their attempts to explain the spectacular effects of motion that lay at the heart of early cinema and the pair s debts to sergei eisenstein and others this reconstruction is followed by a look at applications of the term to more recent film productions from the works of the wachowski brothers to virtual reality and video games with essays by an impressive collection of international film scholars and featuring contributions by gunning and gaudreault as well the cinema of attractions reloaded will be necessary reading for all scholars of early film and its continuing influence

hollywood has a long tradition of bringing in emigre directors from around the world dating back to the silent era today as the film industry is ever more global the people who make blockbuster movies seemingly reflect this tradition hailing from many countries across the world but that fact hides a fundamental difference one that melis behlil examines in hollywood is everywhere today s hollywood studios are themselves transnational with ownership structures and financial arrangements that stretch far

beyond the borders of the united states seen in that context today s international directors are less analogous to the emigre talent of the past than to ordinary transnational employees of other major global corporations

this book the first full critical overview of the film avant garde ushers in a new approach and in the process creates its own subject while many books have studied particular aspects of the european film avant garde of the 1920s and 1930s moving forward looking back provides a much needed summary of the theory and practice of the movement while also emphasizing aspects of the period that have been overlooked arguing that a european perspective is the only way to understand the transnational movement the book also pioneers a new approach to the alternative cinema network that sustained the avant garde paying particular attention to the emergence of film culture as visible in screening clubs film festivals and archives it will be essential to anyone interested in the influential movement and the film culture it created

reviews the poverty measuring practices available measures of poverty and economic growth figures of nepal the poverty rates for fy 1976 77 1984 85 and 1995 96 are found to be not comparable due to change in methodology over time the three poverty rates average 40 nepal has experienced high economic growth during the 7th 1985 86 to 1989 90 and 8th 1992 93 to 1996 97 plan periods with no strong evidences of poverty reduction this incompatible result is partially explained by comparing growth of the agricultural sector with the role of the sector in providing employment and income generation at the household level and by comparing social indicators particularly literacy rate with the growth of the nonagricultural sector tables
