labeling them with words or phrases that describe the connection Benefits of concept mapping Improves understanding Visualizing relationships between concepts enhances comprehension and retention of information Facilitates critical thinking Encourages analysis synthesis and evaluation of information Promotes creativity Stimulates brainstorming and generation of new ideas Enhances communication Provides a clear and concise way to present complex information

Exercise 3 Question Explain the concept of analogies and provide an example of how it can be used in concept development Answer Analogies are comparisons between two different things that share similar characteristics or relationships They are helpful in understanding new concepts by drawing parallels with familiar ones Example Concept The process of photosynthesis Analogy Imagine a factory that takes in raw materials carbon dioxide and water and uses sunlight as energy to produce a valuable product sugar The factory then releases waste products oxygen back into the environment
