the historic american engineering record haer is pleased to announce the publication of covered bridges and the birth of american engineering 2015 edited by haer historian justine christianson and haer architect christopher h marston the book represents the culmination of research under the federal highway administration fhwa sponsored national historic covered bridge preservation nhcbp program haer and the fhwa s office of infrastructure research and development have maintained a joint research and technology program for historic covered bridges since 2002 this partnership has also included a variety of initiatives including documentation engineering studies national historic landmark designations conferences and a traveling exhibition this book examines the development of wood trusses and covered bridge construction profiles the pioneering craftsmen and engineers involved explores the function of trusses in covered bridges and looks at the preservation and future of these distinctly american bridges the editors have collaborated with some of the leading historians and engineers of historic covered bridges in the country to produce this volume contributors include jim barker lola bennett joseph conwill dario gasparini matthew reckard and rachel sangree richard o connor and sheila rimal duwadi supplied overviews of the haer and nhcbp programs and michael harrison and david simmons provided invaluable editorial assistance publisher s website

the strategic plan for bridge engineering issued by aashto in 2005 identified extending the service life and optimizing structural systems of bridges in the united states as two grand challenges in bridge engineering with the objective of producing safer bridges that have a minimum service life of 75 years and reduced maintenance cost material deterioration was identified as one of the primary challenges to achieving the objective of extended life in substructural applications e g deep foundation construction materials such as timber steel and concrete are subjected to deterioration due to environmental impacts using innovative and new

materials for foundation applications makes the aashto objective of 75 years service life achievable ultra high performance concrete uhpc with compressive strength of 180 mpa 26 000 psi and excellent durability has been used in superstructure applications but not in geotechnical and foundation applications this study explores the use of precast prestressed uhpc piles in future foundations of bridges and other structures an h shaped uhpc section which is 10 in 250 mm deep with weight similar to that of an hp 10x57 steel pile was designed to improve constructability and reduce cost in this project instrumented uhpc piles were cast and laboratory and field tests were conducted laboratory tests were used to verify the moment curvature response of uhpc pile section in the field two uhpc piles have been successfully driven in glacial till clay soil and load tested under vertical and lateral loads this report provides a complete set of results for the field investigation conducted on uhpc h shaped piles test results durability drivability and other material advantages over normal concrete and steel indicate that uhpc piles are a viable alternative to achieve the goals of aashto strategic plan

this project examined various methods of innovative bridge design and construction techniques to expedite construction the following methods have been identified as possible method of reducing the time needed for bridge construction precast substructures prefabricated composite bridge units prefabricated superstructure units such as adjacent boxes which do not need a separate wearing surface full depth precast concrete decks stay in place concrete or steel forms completely prefabricated bridges and rapid curing concrete materials the first 6 items have been tried in various states and the results of these trials can be found in an aashto technology implementation group tig report at ashtotig.org in order to find additional information on barriers to rapid construction a survey of contractors was conducted this survey showed that the main obstacle to fast bridge construction is the forming of the deck the contractors also indicated that the best way to build bridges faster was to allow the entire bridge to be closed and the reconstruction to occur all at one time one possible solution to the deck forming problem is the use of stay in place steel deck forms a survey of states showed that approximately 34 states use stay in place steel forms for decks the main concerns about using these forms are the inability to inspect the underside of the deck trapping moisture between the concrete and the form deterioration of the form and additional weight due to the flutes in the forms however those states which use sip steel forms contend that all of these concerns can be overcome an attempt was made to assess the cost of implementation but as most of the techniques are still in a pilot phase cost information was not available

this report presents the development of regionally calibrated lrfd resistance factors for bridge pile foundations in iowa based on reliability theory focusing on the strength limit states and incorporating the construction control aspects and soil setup into the design process the calibration framework was selected to follow the

guidelines provided by the american association of state highway and transportation officials aashto taking into consideration the current local practices the resistance factors were developed for general and in house static analysis methods used for the design of pile foundations as well as for dynamic analysis methods and dynamic formulas used for construction control

of the approximately 25 000 bridges in iowa 28 are classified as structurally deficient functionally obsolete or both the state of iowa thus follows the national trend of an aging infrastructure in dire need of repair or replacement with a relatively limited funding base therefore there is a need to develop new materials with properties that may lead to longer life spans and reduced life cycle costs in addition new methods for determining the condition of structures are needed to monitor the structures effectively and identify when the useful life of the structure has expired or other maintenance is needed high performance steel hps has emerged as a material with enhanced weldability weathering capabilities and fracture toughness compared to conventional structural steels in 2004 the iowa department of transportation opened iowa s first hps girder bridge the east 12th street bridge over i 235 in des moines ia the objective of this project was to evaluate hps as a viable option for use in iowa bridges with a continuous structural health monitoring shm system the scope of the project included documenting the construction of the east 12th street bridge and concurrently developing a remote continuous shm system using fiber optic sensing technology to evaluate the structural performance of the bridge the shm system included bridge evaluation parameters similar to design parameters used by bridge engineers for evaluating the structure through the successful completion of this project a baseline of bridge performance was established that can be used for continued long term monitoring of the structure in general the structural performance of the hps bridge exceeded the design parameters and is performing well although some problems were encountered with the shm system the system functions well and recommendations for improving the system have been made

based on the conclusions of ihrb project tr 444 demonstration project using railroad flat car bridges for low volume road bridges additional research on the use of rrfc bridges was undertaken this portion of the project investigated the following different design and rating procedures additional single span configurations plus multiple span configurations different mechanisms for connecting adjacent rrfcs and the resulting lateral load distribution factors sheet pile abutments behavior rrfc s that had been strengthened so that they could be used on existing abutments a total of eight rrfc bridges were tested five single span bridges two two span bridges and one three span bridge based on the results of this study a simplified design and rating procedure has been developed for the economical replacement bridge alternative in volume 1 this volume the results from the testing of four single span rrfc bridges are presented while in volume 2 the results from the testing of the strengthened single span bridge plus the three multiple span bridges are presented

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
