in an accessible and easy to follow manner this concise textbook on sports medicine provides a useful resource for those students and practitioners of sports medicine and rehabilitation athletic training physiotherapy and orthopedic surgery

this superbly illustrated book provides information of outstanding quality on the presentation and management of the entire range of sports injuries and conditions likely to be encountered by the sports medicine physician as well as many other topics relating to sports activity events and outcomes it is the product of close collaboration among members of several isakos committees and the chapter authors are clinicians and scientists from across the world who are acknowledged experts in sports medicine and orthopedics the book opens by discussing fundamental topics and principles covering subjects such as the biomechanics of injuries physiological demands in sports practice sports activity at different ages nutrition and hydration strength and conditioning injury prevention recovery rehabilitation and return to play subsequent chapters focus in depth on overtraining injuries neurological disorders sports trauma to different parts of the body and special clinical conditions further topics to be addressed are different scenarios in sports e g indoor vs outdoor sports equipment biologic treatment of sports injuries major sporting events and patient recorded outcome measures

ideal for doctors who have not specialised in sports medicine this work offers all of the practical guidance needed to diagnose sports related injuries treat them appropriately and refer them to a specialist if necessary

throughout the twentieth century interest in sport has evidenced a major increase worldwide and a new field of sports medicine has emerged sport spectators hip has been stimulated in part by the increased ease of international travel and the introduction of new means of communication interest in professional sports and in such events as

the world cup and the olympic games has never been higher and the general popularity of sports has drawn increasingly greater numbers of young people to sports participation interest in sports participation has been strengthened both by the provision of numerous sports facilities to populations throughout the world and the accumulating information base that relates regular participation in programs of sport and exercise to health enhancement along with increases in interest and participation has come a need for a better understanding of the physiological changes accompanying muscular activity and of the trauma that can result from both competitive sport and recreational exercise

sports medicine is a popular medical subspecialty sports medicine certainly overlaps with general musculoskeletal medicine but there are important differences to be aware of this book provides comprehensive pertinent information about sports medicine so that the busy clinician can find it accessible and practical medical students residents and fellows will find the book useful for providing an accessible overview of the most salient points in the field of sports medicine

sports medicine and sports science are relatively new and rapidly developing fields of knowledge during the past 2 decades a significant body of scientific knowledge has been published in these areas however there is a demand for practical references which address sports medicine and science in the context of different sports this demand is higher in some sports including combat sports which are highly physically and mentally demanding and cause challenging issues such as risk of blood borne infections weight reduction head injuries stress management and safety for women and children this book has been developed to meet the needs of the practitioners who work with combat sports athletes in order to improve their health and performance combat sports include four olympic sports boxing wrestling judo and taekwondo and other popular sports such as karate kick boxing and wushu these sports are popular in most countries of the world both at competitive and recreational levels combat sports are practiced by people of different ages for a variety of reasons such as to gain fitness and health benefits and to learn self defense

in our increasingly active society children teenagers adults and the elderly are swimming jogging weight training and competing in a wide variety of individual and team sports approximately 85-95% of athletic problems are handled by primary care providers many of whom are serving as team or school doctors sports medicine for the primary care physician second edition provides the latest information on major topics in sports science and clinical medicine that affect primary care physicians the first section of the book presents the history of sports medicine the role of the primary care doctor in sports and the scientific ingredients of good athletic care e.g. pre participation exam drugs doping prevention and protective equipment nutrition the second section considers the nonoperative management of common sports injuries after an introduction in which epidemiological rehabilitative and healing concerns are presented on field emergencies and their management are discussed general and individual sport injuries are detailed in a cohesive consistent format that includes relevant anatomy epidemiology common eponyms mechanism of injury history physical laboratory and radiological findings differential diagnosis treatment rehabilitation consultation guidelines and prognosis and prevention chapter bibliographies provide general and specific references for additional

information appendices include pertinent sports curricula for professionals involved in athletic care equipment lists acsm position statements sports jargon compendium and a detailed guide to common stretching rehabilitative exercises the book contains 259 illustrations and 98 tables

the phrase sports medicine is not specific to one career profession it instead encompasses a group of professionals from various disciplines whose focus is the health of an athlete athletes can be all ages and play on all different levels a person interested in becoming an orthopedic sports medicine specialist must complete four years of medical school after their undergraduate schooling is completed training continues with a five year residency in orthopedics in order to sub specialize which is the case with an orthopedic sports medicine another two to four years of training is required this book is a practical guide to the field of sports science and the treatment of sports injuries written for students in sports science and medicine trainees and specialists in sports medicine and related disciplines the book presents the clinical management of both acute and chronic sports injuries and medical problems alongside the background and basic science of sports medicine hopefully the present book will be useful for the students of physical education and sports sciences and other related courses

most books on imaging in sports medicine are concerned with the particular joints or anatomy involved in sports related injuries this book however takes a different perspective by looking at injuries that are associated with specific sports all of the well known major sports such as football tennis and basketball are included as are many less common but still very popular sports such as baseball american football and rugby the chapters on sports specific injuries are preceded by two chapters on the perspective of clinicians and another two chapters on the general use of mr imaging and ultrasound in sports medicine the authors of the book are world renowned experts from five continents imaging in sports specific musculoskeletal injuries should be of great interest to radiologists sports medicine physicians orthopedic surgeons and rehabilitation physicians and to anyone interested in the treatment of sports related injuries

aim of this book is to give an update on the main issues in sports traumatology and orthopedics involving different body sections exploring the most important aspects of sports medicine from anatomy to normal movements description from diagnosis to

sports injuries treatment from conservative to surgical treatments it gives a global overview of the field describing also diagnostic tools recently introduced in this field such as hip arthroscopy and taking into consideration related areas like nutrition prevention training and rehabilitation the single chapters deal with relevant problems such as emergencies on the field pathologies of the upper and lower extremity spine problems in athletes each injury is approached on the basis of both the specific body area and of the different sports activities written by a multidisciplinary team of experts this volume will be a fundamental book for orthopedic surgeons physiotherapists general practitioners personal and athletic trainers offering them a useful tool for the management of most frequent injuries in sports medicine

sports injuries and sports medicine are both very important topics of discuss in the field of sports and physical education these two topics are well explained briefly with important facts and essentials sports injury requires substantially more than treatment of an injured area patients need advice on a number of other aspects including maintenance of overall fitness during recovery and require a suitable prognosis if physical treatment is desirable it is necessary to have some knowledge of therapeutic modalities and preferably a sound professional working relationship with the therapist of choice the book covers sports medicine physiotherapy hydrotherapy and therapeutic exercise

recommends levels of patient oriented evidence to assist physicians in their diagnoses also included is a link to videos that demonstrate important musculoskeletal maneuvers used in sports medicine as exercise and sports move beyond the realm of leisurely activity to a necessary component of good health this book has become an important resource for all those involved in sports medicine
