politeness is a big theme in the studies of pragmatics it has been discussed for the last seventy years and yet certain depth can still be added into the body of works this book is written to connect the classical theories of politeness and the practical applications of politeness in the digital age today we are faced with two kinds of interactions due to technological advancements face to face interaction and cyber interaction both interactions seem to use the same mechanism of semantics and pragmatics however in reality they have gaps with this in mind i feel the urge to make those gaps explicit those discrepancies between face to face and cyber interaction may not be intuitive even in some cases they are counter intuitive we human beings have been utilizing face to face interaction for at least forty thousand years yet in the last twenty years cyber communication has been infiltrating our life the infiltration started with small and limited application like email and short messages but now the infiltration has been securing some hours of our daily communications among human beings humans from all ages plunge in the arena of cyber communication we may have had the assumption of face to face interaction politeness principles and features transferred to its cyber counterpart and vice versa some of those politeness principles and features work well in both worlds those are human made principles and used in the human world anyway however it is so often some principles which work well in a medium fail to convert comfortably in the other medium

much like in everyday life politeness is key to the smooth running of relationships and interactions professional contexts however tend to be characterised by a plethora of behaviours that may be specific to that context they include polite behaviours impolite behaviours and behaviours that arguably fall somewhere between or outside such concepts the twelve chapters making up this edited collection explore these behaviours in a range of communication contexts representative of business medical legal and security settings between them the contributions will help readers to theorize about and in some cases operationalize im politeness and related behaviours for these real world settings the authors take a broad yet theoretically underpinned definition of politeness and use it to help explain analyse and inform professional interactions they demonstrate the importance of understanding how interactions are negotiated and managed in professional settings the edited collection has something to offer therefore to academics professionals and practitioners alike

this study investigates the interface of power and politeness in the realization of disagreements in naturalistic language data power and politeness are important phenomena in face to face interaction disagreement is an arena in which these two key concepts are likely to be observed together both disagreement and the exercise of power entail a conflict and at the same time conflict will often be softened by the display of politeness defined as marked relational work the concept of power is of special interest to the field of linguistics in that language is one of the primary means to exercise power often correlated with status and regarded as an influential aspect of situated speech the workings of the exercise of power however have rarely been formally articulated this study provides a theoretical framework within which to analyze the observed instances of disagreement and their co occurrence with the exercise of power and display of politeness in this framework a checklist of propositions that allow us to operationalize the concept of power and identify its exercise in naturalistic linguistic data is combined with a view of language as socially constructed a qualitative approach is used to analyze the concepts of power and politeness the material for analysis comes from three different contexts 1 a sociable argument in an informal supportive and interactive family setting 2 a business meeting among colleagues within a research institution and 3 examples from public discourse collected during the us election 2000

the second edition of this collection of 13 original papers contains an updated introductory section detailing the significance that the original articles published in 1992 have for the further development of research into linguistic politeness into the 21st century the original articles focus on the phenomenon of politeness in language they present the most important problems in developing a theory of linguistic politeness which must deal with the crucial differences between lay notions of politeness in different cultures and the term politeness as a concept within a theory of linguistic politeness the universal validity of the term itself is called into question as are models such as those developed by brown and levinson lakoff and leech new approaches are suggested in addition to this theoretical discussion an empirical section presents a number of case studies and research projects in linguistic politeness these show what has been achieved within current models and what still remains to be done in particular with reference to cross cultural studies in politeness and differences between a western and a non western approach to the subject the publication of this second edition demonstrates that the significance of the collection is just as salient in the first decade of the new millennium as it was at the beginning of the 1990s

seminar paper from the year 2006 in the subject english language and literature studies linguistics grade 1 3 university of marburg institution für anglistik und amerikanistik course hauptseminar strategic writing in english as a second language language english abstract the following paper seeks to be an empirical approach to the usage of clear and polite expressions in written communication the material concerned are think aloud protocols so called taps and respective letters written by students in their hauptstudium who got the task to write to an imaginary guest professor and record their thoughts while doing this the letters were first written in english l2 and afterwards in german l1 but since the main concept of politeness is very similar in these two languages and a detailed analysis of cultural differences would reach beyond the scope of this paper only the english letters are concerned here the students were supposed to remind the professor of correcting their term paper early because the credit was needed for the registration to their final exams obviously this task requires to deal with the conflict between polite behaviour and a precise presentation of facts as it will be shown it is on the one hand often not easy to be friendly and polite when one simultaneously wants to get an important message across on the other hand there is the danger of creating a negative impression if one exaggerates politeness since i am one of the students who had to write an imaginary letter and especially since i already had to write similar letters in reality and am likely to have to do it again i am really interested in the study of politeness the close relation between theory and practice here makes the topic very

attractive 32 letters were written and afterwards ranked into a quality scale ranging from high top to deep low from each of these categories at least one letter will be picked out for a detailed analysis the paper is based on the theoretical background of three different models of politeness by lakoff leech and brown and levinson which have in common that they are all linked somehow to grice s cooperative principle while brown and levinson s approach seems to be the most elaborate one the four gricean maxims have to be adhered to in a communicative act for the sake of clarity but as it will be shown they are often violated in favour of polite speech all of these models can be criticized more or less but since the purpose of this paper is a strong focus on the empirical part those criticisms will not be taken into consideration here

politeness is crucial to successful communication and is consequently of great interest to those who study language in its social context this book presents the first application of brown and levinson s ground breaking theoretical work in a full length comparative case study maria sifianou draws her data from a variety of sources including literature particularly drama questionnaires and personal observation she attempts to discover the principles underlying social interaction in both intracultural and intercultural contexts and discusses the extent to which the concept of politeness is common to different cultures she argues that politeness is conceptualized differently and thus manifested differently in the two societies under study greeks tend to use more positive politeness devices than the english who prefer more negative devices positive politeness is more closely related to friendliness negative politeness to formality dr sifianou s analysis illustrates and supports the general claim that despite popular stereotypes there can be no objective verification for the view that one nation is more polite than another
