the papers for this special issue were selected from a pool of nearly 700 presentations which were made at the 10th congress of the world council of comparative education societies wcces which was held in cape town south africa from 12 to 17 july 1998 the congress was hosted

by the southern african comparative and history of education society saches and held on the campuses of the university of the western cape and the university of cape town the papers were selected by the convenors of the conference s standing commissions which provided a significant focus for the conference proceedings these commissions were on the following themes teachers and teacher education curriculum higher education lifelong learning language literacy and basic education gender and education policy theory and theory shifts basic education in africa peace and justice dependency european education policy research in africa culture indigenous knowledge and learning the papers presented as the discussion below makes clear ranged widely in subject matter and theoretical perspective and addressed issues of concern both to individual countries and to regions of the world while some of the papers use comparison as an approach it remains a matter of concern that the comparative perspective is so little in evidence it is hoped that the comparative research approach will be more in evidence in the future

carefully curated to highlight research from more than twenty countries the international critical pedagogy reader introduces the ways the educational phenomenon that is critical pedagogy are being reinvented and reframed around the world a collection of essays from both historical and contemporary thinkers coupled with original essays introduce this school of thought and approach it from a wide variety of cultural social and political perspectives academics from south america europe africa the middle east asia and north america describe critical pedagogy s political ideological and intellectual foundations tracing its international evolution and unveiling how key scholars address similar educational challenges in diverse national contexts each section links theory to critical classroom practices and includes a list of sources for further reading to expand upon the selections offered in this volume a robust collection this reader is a crucial text for teaching and understanding critical pedagogy on a truly international level winner of the 2016 alpha sigma nu book award

this book uses a gender perspective to examine sermons and other officially endorsed discourses of the catholic church in eighteenth and nineteenth century mexico city analyzing the different ways that over time gendered images metaphors and hagiographical examples were used in sermons and other documents the book examines how the church negotiated challenges to its cultural and ideological hegemony beginning with sermons from the early eighteenth century the author follows the evolution of church discourses as preachers reveled in baroque analogies embraced ideals of the enlightenment targeted women s alleged moral vices at times of political crisis and ultimately turned to notions of women as the devout sex in order to combat incipient liberalism put another way liberals after independence were not the only ones to assert a kind of republican motherhood preachers countered with a vision of catholic motherhood that had great resonance in mexico even into the twentieth century

this book presents a state of the art cross linguistic survey of applicative constructions in the functional typological tradition an introductory section sets the terminological and analytical stage presents the methodology used by the different chapters and provides a typological outlook the individual contributions address the

morphological syntactic and semantic variation of applicatives as well as their discourse pragmatic function they cover all major language families and some isolates that feature some illuminating version of the phenomenon paying special attention to language internal variation and unity the phenomena surveyed range from those instances usually considered canonical valency increasing syntactically and semantically predictable productive dedicated and optional to those occasionally understudied in descriptive works and frequently neglected in comparative studies valency neutral rather unpredictable lexicalized syncretic and or obligatory

as the 21st century unfolds the traditional welfare state that evolved during the 20th century faces serious threats to the solidarity that social programs were meant to strengthen the rise of populist and nationalist parties reflects the decline of a sense of belonging and inclusiveness that mass education and economic progress were meant to foster as traditional politics and parties are rejected by working and middle class individuals who were previously their staunchest supporters increasingly these groups reject the growing gaps in income power and privilege that they perceive between themselves and highly educated and cosmopolitan business academic and political elites when strangers become family examines the potential role of civil society organizations in guaranteeing the rights and addressing the needs of vulnerable groups paying particular attention to their role in advocacy for and service delivery to older people the book includes a discussion of the origins and functions of this sector that focuses on the relationship between the state and non governmental organizations as well as a close examination of mexico a middle income nation with a rapidly aging population and limited state welfare for older people the data reveals important aspects of the relationship among government actors civil society organizations and political parties ronald angel and verónica montes de oca zavalá ask the fundamental question about the extent to which civil society organizations represent a potential mechanism whereby vulnerable individuals can join together to further their own interests and exercise their individual and group autonomy

this is the first scholarly volume to offer an insight into the less known stories of women children and international volunteers in the spanish civil war special attention is given to volunteers of different historical experiences especially jews and voices from less researched countries in the context of the spanish war such as palestine and turkey of an interdisciplinary nature this volume brings together historians and literary scholars from different countries their research is based on newly found primary sources in both national and private archives as well as on post essentialist methodological insights for women s history jewish history and studies on belonging by bringing together a group of emerging and senior scholars from different countries we highlight the polyphony of voices of diverse individuals drawn into the spanish civil war contributors to this volume have explored new or little researched primary sources found in archives and documentary centers including papers held by relatives of the people we study the volume is aimed at both scholarly and non scholarly public including any readers interested in the spanish civil war twentieth century european history jewish studies women s history or anti fascism this volume can be used both in

undergraduate college courses and in postgraduate university seminars

el naturalismo en la novela cubana is an in depth study of cuban novels published between 1830 and 1927 sintia molina examines the term naturalism from a cultural social and political perspective she shows that cuban writers appropriated the european aesthetic to develop it into an ideology that dominated cuban narrative for decades until it evolved into a characteristically cuban form of artistic expression drawing on modern studies of naturalism molina focuses on the unique characteristics of cuban naturalism and its influence on early twentieth century cuban society text in spanish
