the 3rd edition presents information on common tests as well as rare and highly specialized tests and procedures biological variables that may affect test results are discussed and a focus is placed on reference ranges diagnostic information clinical interpretation of laboratory data interferences and specimen types includes a section on molecular pathology and tests have been added in the areas of endocrinology immunochemistry serologic hepatitis testing and more

quality assurance qa is an integral and very important part of laboratory medicine pathologists microbiologists biochemists and laboratory technicians all need to be proficient in this subject qa is also mandatory for obtaining accreditation which ensures a certain level of quality in services being provided the subject of quality assurance qa though not new is a relatively neglected entity and is looked at with some degree of apprehension this book is addressed to those entrusted with implementing quality assurance qa in laboratory medicine generally these are persons with basic training as pathologists this handbook is meant as a beginner and handy guide to quality assurance all the basics of quality assurance have been incorporated to encourage the beginner to make a start

systems and the clinical and laboratory standards institute clsi it is based on training sessions and modules provided by the cdc and who in more than 25 countries and on guidelines for implementation of iso 15189 in diagnostic laboratories developed by clsi this handbook is intended to provide a comprehensive reference on laboratory quality management system for all stakeholders in health laboratory processes from management to administration to bench work laboratorians this handbook covers topics that are essential for quality management of a public health or clinical laboratory they are based on both iso 15189 and clsi gp26 a3 documents each topic is discussed in a separate chapter the chapters follow the framework developed by clsi and are organized as the 12 quality system essentials
