vivid adjectives and metaphors to describe their appearance For example instead of saying He was tall try He towered above me his shadow stretching across the pavement Sound How does their voice sound Do they have a distinct accent or way of speaking Are there any sounds they make like a nervous cough or a soft sigh Smell Can you smell their perfume or cologne Do they have a particular scent associated with them like the aroma of baking cookies or the smell of sawdust Taste If relevant use taste to create a more complete picture For example if youre describing a chef you might mention the taste of their food Touch What does it feel like to touch their skin Is it rough smooth warm or cold Section 3 Crafting Evocative Language Using strong evocative language is key to creating a powerful portrait Instead of relying on clichs or generic terms try to find words that paint a clear picture in the readers mind Strong Adjectives and Adverbs Choose descriptive words that accurately portray your subjects physical features personality and emotions For example instead of He was angry try His face contorted with rage his eyes blazing like burning coals Metaphors and Similes Use these literary devices to create memorable comparisons For instance Her laughter was like the tinkling of wind chimes or His gaze was as cold as steel Figurative Language Experiment with other forms of figurative language like personification hyperbole and understatement to add depth and richness to your descriptions Section 4 Show Dont Tell Instead of simply telling the reader what a person is like
