Dr Expert 2 Name In feline patients we often see elevated ALP alkaline phosphatase levels with liver disease This enzyme can be elevated in various conditions but when combined with other biomarkers and a thorough clinical examination it can provide valuable insights

Dr Expert 3 Name One major consideration is ensuring that the chosen diagnostics are appropriate for the patient's needs and financial capabilities While advanced testing can be incredibly informative it might not always be
