keith nickle provides a revised and updated edition of a well respected resource that fills the gap between cursory treatments of the synoptic gospels by new testament introductions and exhaustive treatments in commentaries in a clear and concise manner

nickles explores the major issues of faith that influenced the writers of the gospels the synoptic gospels is helpful for classroom or personal use

anyone who has done a serious study of the gospel of john and then sought to compare that gospel with matthew mark and luke found that they were immediately confronted with many differences over the years i have studied all the gospels and this has increased my interest in how others were handling these differences both in their teaching and in their sermons to my surprise most of the people consulted have never made an honest effort to have some answer for these differences furthermore i have not been able to locate any books that speak to the one problem of these differences

a lively readable and up to date guide to the synoptic problem ideal for undergraduate students and the general reader

this 1938 book reopened a question generally held to have been settled the sources from which st john derived the material for his gospel the accepted view that used the narratives of mark and luke mr gardner smith finds not proved examining the gospel afresh in order to test this theory

a history of the synoptic problem by david laird dungan is an accessible academic study of a question that has needled readers of the new testament since before the bible was canonized how does one reconcile the different accounts of jesus s life given by the four gospels today the most highly publicized answer to this question is the one offered by john dominic crossan and the jesus seminar who seek to reconcile the differences among the gospels by designating some events and statements in the gospels historically true and others false there are lots of other ways to explore the synoptic problem however and dungan provides a clear and lively history of the strategies employed by origen augustine erasmus spinoza locke and others dungan s method is to break the synoptic problem down into its corollary questions which gospels should be considered in the debate which text of each gospel should be considered and how should one read the bible in general and the gospels in particular dungan s interest in these questions is not merely literary he also delves into the political and economic agendas that have influenced biblical interpretation in this regard the most interesting and original connection he makes is to explain the relationship between the rise of the modern historical critical method of reading scripture asking who wrote the books of the bible when how and for whom and the creation and maintenance of political democracy and furthermore the ways in which fundamentalist literal readings of scripture serve the same goal dungan s own investment in debates on the synoptic problem is shot through with an appealing humility about the stakes of the debate at its deepest level the synoptic problem is not a scientific problem he writes t he quest for the correct solution

to the synoptic problem like the church's quest for the correct canon of the gospels and the correct text of the gospels and the correct way to interpret the gospels is a vital aspect of the church's perennial quest for the word of life

context of second temple judaism although others have treated individual psalm quotations as prophecy my work is the first to examine all of the psalm quotations within the synoptic gospels in this light and the first to demonstrate that these excerpts were used prophetically in some cases these psalm quotations were used by the synoptic evangelists in a manner that is thought to fulfill a prophecy from or about jesus within the gospel narratives even though this particular use of the psalms by the synoptic evangelists has not been widely recognized previously this study shows how similar exegetical techniques of looking for prophecies in the psalms was practiced by non christian jews of the period

this book makes a major contribution to the ongoing debate about the synoptic problem especially concerning the question of which gospel was written first the scholarly consensus developed over two hundred years of discussion has favoured markan priority and the dependence of both matthew and luke upon mark in an ongoing contemporary revival of the griesbach hypothesis some scholars have advocated the view that mark used conflated and abbreviated matthew and luke the author explores the role played by arguments connected with christological development in support of both these views deploying a comparative redaction critical approach to the problem dr head argues that the critical basis of the standard christological argument for markan priority is insecure and based on anachronistic scholarly concerns nevertheless in a through going comparative reappraisal of the christological outlooks of matthew and mark the author finds decisive support for the hypothesis of markan priority arguing that matthew was a developer rather than a corrector of mark
