this book explores wilde's works from the hypothesis that they call upon the active participation of the reader in the production of meaning it has a twofold objective first it shows that wilde's emphasis on the creative role of the audience in his critical writings makes him conceive the reader as a co creator in the construction of meaning second it analyses the strategies which wilde employs to impel the reader to collaborate in the creation of meaning of his literary works and casts light upon the social criticism derived from these the examination of wilde's writings reveals how he gradually combined more sophisticated techniques that encouraged the reader's dynamic role with the progressive exploitation of self advertising strategies for professional purposes these allowed the commercial oscar to make his works successful among the victorian public without betraying the literary wilde's aesthetic principles the present study re evaluates wilde as a critic and as a writer it demonstrates that while wilde the myth was ahead of his time in many ways wilde the artist anticipated in his aesthetic theory various themes which occupy contemporary literary theoreticians thus it may contribute to give him the status he rightly deserves in the history of literature

the poetics of philosophy is my attempt to hear what academic philosophy attempts to silence namely how reason resonates with madness it is thus a stinging of the great steed of academia in order to recover and re experience what otherwise would be repressed by the exigencies of bureaucratic commodity life in the late capitalist world an analysis of plato's principal dialogues with a view towards developing the author's conception of thinking knowing and loving it incorporates the insights of heidegger nietzsche and derrida provoking the world mind to reflect upon its phenomenological possibility for being dispersed within its daily routines or

business the book argues for the metaphysicality of physical reality articulated through the narrative trope of fractal dialectical logic the present volume's more general implications extend the insights of the author's previous work in the area of social science i refer to the possibility for world communist revolution which is predicated on communism's thorough ridding itself of its naïve materialist perspective the relics of a newtonian universe and its embracing of a fractal dialectical logic or similar that is better able to incorporate the yearning for immortality desire to experience beauty and the need to have a meaningful life that define human species life to articulate such a framework is the aim of my general research

an open access edition is available thanks to the kind sponsorship of the libraries participating in the jisc open access community framework openup initiative debates about reading in postcolonial studies rarely discuss non professional readers except to secure the authority of professional reading practices in reading postcolonial literature hayley g toth places non professional reading practices in dialogue with received academic wisdom to debunk common sense assumptions about non professional readers as western or neocolonial consumers drawing on reading practices recorded in academic books journal articles and on online book reviewing platforms like amazon and goodreads toth draws attention to important continuities between professional and non professional practices of reading postcolonial literature at the same time she highlights that non professionals often have little desire to emulate the practices of professional postcolonial critics precisely by not adopting the established protocols and methods of postcolonial studies non professional readers call attention to the limits of dominant approaches to reading in the discipline across four chapters toth examines the relationship between reading and identity during the rushdie affair the difference between reading and address the challenges posed by difficult texts and the legitimacy of non understanding and the reception of popular texts primarily read by non professional audiences reading postcolonial literature demonstrates that reception

matters in any claims we make about the value of reading postcolonial literature and offers new ways forward for the practice study and teaching of reading in the discipline

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
