the un convention on the rights of the child lays down the right of children to form their own opinions as well as the right to express these opinions in the light of this the ombudsman for children in sweden has created young speakers a qualitative method which recognises and elevates the voices of young people without adult adjustment or correction the rationale for the method is that children are experts on their own lives and have important information to share with decision makers it is about listening to reflections nuances and in depth stories that are difficult to understand and take into account without going into detail by listening to different people tell their personal stories about the same topics patterns trends and shortcomings can be identified

nordic law is often referred to as something different from other legal systems at the same time it is a common belief that the nordic countries share more or less the same legal tradition and are very similar in their approach to the law considering both of these points of view the book tells a story of how nordic law and nordic legal thinking differ from other legal systems and how there are many particularities in the law of each of the nordic countries making them different from each other the idea of nordic law also conceals national features the basic premise of the book is that even if strictly speaking there is no such thing as a nordic common law it still makes sense to speak of nordic law and that acquiring a more than basic knowledge of this law is interesting not only for comparative lawyers but also helpful for those working with nordic lawyers and dealing with questions involving law in the nordic countries

this interdisciplinary study focuses on sonic poetry an experimental artistic practice in the post digital era it discusses a transmedial language based sound art according to literary concepts as well as media theory linguistics and sound studies the book explores how digital and media technologies shape the creation of experimental
