what happens when local unions begin to advocate for the rights of temporary migrant workers asks michele ford in her sweeping study of seven asian countries until recently unions in hong kong japan malaysia singapore south korea taiwan and thailand were uniformly hostile towards foreign workers but ford deftly shows how times and attitudes have begun to change now she argues ngos and the global union federations are encouraging local unions to represent and advocate for these peripheral workers and in some cases succeeding from migrant to worker builds our understanding of the role the international labor movement and local unions have had in developing a movement for migrant workers labor rights ford examines the relationship between different kinds of labor movement actors and the constraints imposed on those actors by resource flows contingency and local context her conclusions show that in countries hong kong malaysia and thailand where resource flows and local factors give the global union federations more influence local unions have become much more engaged with migrant workers but in

countries japan and taiwan for example where they have little effect there has been little progress while much has changed ford forces us to see that labor migration in asia is still fraught with complications and hardships and that local unions are not always able or willing to act

as the struggle against neoliberalism becomes ever more global just work will be the definitive book on the growing social and political power of one its major forces migrant labor from trade unions in south africa to resistance in oppressive gulf states migrating forest workers in the czech republic and illegal workers organizations in hong kong just work brings together a wealth of lived experiences and frontline struggles for the first time highlighting developments in the wake of austerity and attacks on traditional forms of labor organizing the contributors show how workers are finding new and innovative ways of resisting the result is both a rich analysis of where the movement stands today and a reminder of the potentially explosive power of migrant workers in the years to come

asean the association of southeast asian nations has made slow progress in defining a regional policy for the protection of migrant workers this book examines the normative structures within the institutions at play at both state and regional level of asean which influence the making of a migrant workers protection policy the author puts forward a novel alternative policy analysis tool the two level state and regional analysis that enables satisfactory explanation for policy making cases whereby normative institutional structures are involved and social policies are considered the author argues that the formulation of a working coherent migrant workers protection policy has not been achieved because of the presence of normative institutional structures with ideas unsupportive to the protection of migrant workers which results in a slow institutionalisation process although the migrant workers in question are their citizens and migrant sending countries are supposed to have more supportive normative structures for workers protection the author finds that when examined closely institutions in both migrant sending and receiving countries tend to have normative structures that are against workers protection these arguments drive the analytical questions of the book to inquire about the forms of the normative structures involved and their influence in the relevant institutions a unique contribution to the study of asean and migration in southeast asia this book will be of interest to academics in the field of social policy migration studies and asian studies in particular southeast asian studies

this study reviews and analyses existing national legislative and administrative provisions and bi lateral agreements regarding social welfare services for migrant workers and their family against the background of relevant international instruments the following topics are examined under three chapter headings conditions for the reunion of families social services in the country of employment education and vocational training of children housing health cultural and religious activities etc and social services in the country of origin help with recruitment procedures emigration formalities preparation for life abroad assistance for family remaining in the home country the study takes into account the changed conditions of international labour migration since 1973 with the virtual stoppage of recruitment by western european countries and the increasing reliance of middle eastern countries on foreign manpower legislation and policies in the countries examined show that international instruments by the means cover all legal aspects of the welfare of migrant workers are often too general and therefore too weak to achieve the intended goals and are seldom fully applied even when ratified by all the states concerned bilateral agreements and national legislative and administrative regulations are labour demand and supply oriented dealing with the migrant as a worker only and not as a human being and make no provision for legal security equality of opportunity or protection from discrimination the report stresses the need for collective action to induce governments to assume their commitments under existing international instruments and to revise and supplement these instruments to make them more responsive to the needs of migrants

recent trends indicate that european countries are admitting more foreign workers to fill labour shortages caused by ageing populations and the increasing globalisation consequently some european countries have adopted new laws and policies in order to attract both highly skilled and less skilled foreign workers however the legal status of these migrants has become a matter of concern the new measures do not entirely meet the established principles and standards of the council of europe aimed at protecting the rights of migrant workers such as those of the european social charter and the european convention on the legal status of migrant workers this study focuses on the rules relating to the legal status of the main categories of migrant workers admitted for employment in some council of europe member states it considers the important question of whether these national rules are structured in a way to assist migrants in their integration in the host country in terms of granting them a secure residence status and economic and social rights or whether they discourage or even prevent such integration
