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this major new study of heidegger is the first to examine in detail the concept of existential truth that heidegger developed in the 1920s daniel dahlstrom offers a critical focus on the genesis nature and viability of heidegger s radical reconceptualization the book has several distinctive and innovative features first it is the only study that attempts to understand the logical dimension of heidegger s thought in its historical context second no other book length treatment

explores the breadth and depth of heidegger s confrontation with husserl his erstwhile mentor third the book demonstrates that heidegger s deconstruction of western thinking occurs on three interconnected fronts truth being and time

this book provides new interpretations of heidegger s philosophical method in light of 20th century postmodernism and 21st century speculative realism in doing so it raises important questions about philosophical method in the age of global warming and climate change vincent blok addresses topics that have yet to be extensively discussed in heidegger scholarship including heidegger s method of questioning the religious character of heidegger s philosophical method and heidegger s conceptualization of philosophical method as explorative confrontation he is also critical of heidegger s conceptuality and develops a post heideggerian concept of philosophical method which provides a new perspective on the role of willing poetry and earth interest in contemporary philosophy this earth interest turns out to be particularly important to consider and leads to critical reflections on heidegger s concept of earth the necessity of earth interest in contemporary philosophy and a post heideggerian concept of the earth heidegger s concept of philosophical method will be of interest primarily to heidegger scholars and graduate students but its discussion of philosophical method and environmental philosophy will also appeal to scholars in other disciplines and areas of philosophy

a new translation of heidegger s early work the realities problem in modern philosophy originally published in 1912 under the german title das realitats problem in der modernen philosophie this edition contains a new afterword by the translator a timeline of heidegger s life and works a philosophic index of core heideggerian concepts and a guide for existentialist terminology across 19th and 20th century existentialists this translation is designed for readability and accessibility to heidegger s enigmatic and dense philosophy complex and specific philosophic terms are translated as literally as possible and academic footnotes have been removed to ensure easy reading this work is critical to understand his initial approach to ontochronology leading to his advanced theories on the phenomenology of time in his major work being and time heidegger argues here that time in the historical sciences is not a homogeneous mathematical series as it is in physics but rather a qualitative context dependent concept he emphasises the importance of understanding time in relation to the specific aims and methodologies of historical science and posits that time in history has a unique meaning and function deeply bound up with the cultural and human context of historical events this approach reflects a broader philosophical inquiry into the nature of being and temporality that heidegger would develop in his later works metaphysics has triumphed over rationalism and empiricism as the only field that is vectored towards the only question that matters

heidegger s lecture course at the university of marburg in the summer of 1925 an early version of

being and time 1927 offers a unique glimpse into the motivations that prompted the writing of this great philosopher's master work and the presuppositions that gave shape to it the book embarks upon a provisional description of what heidegger calls *dasein* the field in which both being and time become manifest heidegger analyzes *dasein* in its everydayness in a deepening sequence of terms being in the world worldhood and care as the being of *dasein* the course ends by sketching the themes of death and conscience and their relevance to an ontology that makes the phenomenon of time central theodore kiesel's outstanding translation permits english speaking readers to appreciate the central importance of this text in the development of heidegger's thought

the concept of time presents heidegger's so called *dilthey* review widely considered the first draft of his celebrated masterpiece being and time here heidegger reveals his deep commitment to wilhelm dilthey and count yorck von wartenburg he agrees with them that historicity must be at the centre of the new philosophy to come however he also argues for an ontological approach to history from this ontological turn he develops the so called categories of *dasein* this work demonstrates heidegger's indebtedness to yorck and dilthey and gives further evidence to the view that thought about history is the germ cell of being and time however it also shows that heidegger's commitment to dilthey was not without reservations and that his analysis of *dasein* actually employs husserl's phenomenology the work reopens the question of history in a broader sense as heidegger struggles to thematize history without aligning it with world historical events the text also provides a concise and readable summary of the main themes of being and time and as such is an ideal companion to that text

this volume presents heidegger's 1924 marburg lectures which lay the intellectual groundwork for his magnum opus being and time here are the seeds of the ideas that would become heidegger's unique and highly influential phenomenology heidegger interprets aristotle's rhetoric and looks closely at the greek notion of *pathos* these lectures offer special insight into the development of his concepts of care and concern being at hand being in the world and attunement which were later elaborated in being and time available in english for the first time these lectures make a significant contribution to ancient philosophy aristotle studies continental philosophy and phenomenology

this study examines the complex relationship between martin heidegger s concept of difference and jacques derrida s neologism *différance* in light of the problem of being set in a theological context it argues that derrida s reflections call into question heidegger s account of difference thus problematizing the *Seinsfrage* and forestalling any theological appropriation of being further it argues that derrida s discourse on *différance* is itself paradoxical indicating its status is logically undecidable inspired by heidegger s charge to think the difference this work characterizes derrida s thought as a response to this mandate and takes as its own task the further thinking through of the problematics of difference in these thinkers

this work offers a critical examination of how heidegger uses the concept of mood in his philosophy of being the author focuses on a specific kind of mood namely anxiety distinguishing this authentic mood from inauthentic ones and then extends the concept outward to encompass rudolf otto s phenomenology of religious feeling by providing a ground for that work there are four stages in the development of the work each taking up a chapter the first provides an introductory basis for understanding heidegger s project in his *Being and Time* through a detailed analysis of his basic terms in chapter two the author turns to the role of mood in disclosing self and world in chapter three the author addresses himself to the marxist interpretation of alienation and the criticism of certain marxists concerning heidegger s concept of anxiety as not

being socially based but merely psychologically based in this context the author refers to the works of adorno kosik lukacs marcuse and kolakowski the focus is on such issues as authenticity freedom and death the fourth and final chapter extends heidegger s remarks concerning mood into the realm of religious mood
