containing oranges and one containing both apples and oranges. The boxes are labeled Apples Oranges and Apples and Oranges but all the labels are incorrect. If you can pick one fruit from one box which box should you pick from to figure out the correct labels? Solution: You should pick a fruit from the box labeled Apples and Oranges. Since all the labels are incorrect this box cannot contain both apples and oranges. Therefore you will either pick an apple or an orange revealing the true contents of that box and allowing you to deduce the correct labels for the other two boxes.
