that any translation will betray the author's language spirit style because of the choices on all sides what to sacrifice clarity or brevity if the formula in the text is brief and effective but impossible to translate into so few words with the exact meaning one could understand this criticism that it encourages us to read in the text it seems obvious that it is impossible to follow this advice into practice
