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george stocking has been widely recognized as the premier historian of anthropology ever since the publication of his first volume of essays race culture and evolution in 1968 as editor of several publications including the highly acclaimed history of anthropology series he has led the movement to establish the history of anthropology as a recognized research specialization in addition to the study victorian anthropology his work includes numerous essays covering a wide range of anthropological topics the eight essays collected in the ethnographer s magic consider the emergence of anthropology since the

late nineteenth century as an academic discipline grounded in systematic fieldwork drawing extensively on unpublished manuscript materials the essays focus primarily on franz boas and bronislaw malinowski the leading figures in the american and the british academic fieldwork traditions according to george marcus of rice university the essays represent the most informative and insightful writings on malinowski and boas and their legacies that are yet available beyond their biographical material the essays here touch upon major themes in the history of anthropology its powerfully mythic aspect and persistent strain of romantic primitivism the contradictions of its relationship to the larger sociopolitical sphere its problematic integration of a variety of natural scientific and humanistic inquiries and the tension between its scientific aspirations and its subjectively acquired data to provide an overview against which to read the other essays stocking has also included a sketch of the history of anthropology from the ancient greeks to the present for this collection stocking has written prefatory commentaries for each of the essays as well as two more extended contextualizing pieces an introductory essay retrospective prescriptive reflections places the volume in autobiographical and historiographical context the afterword postscriptive prospective reflections reconsiders major themes of the essays in relation to the recent past and present situation of academic anthropology

what are the relationships between the self and fieldwork how do personal emotional and identity issues impact upon working in the field this book argues that ethnographers and others involved in fieldwork should be aware of how fieldwork research and ethnographic writing construct reproduce and implicate selves relationships and personal identities all too often research methods texts remain relatively silent about the ways in which fieldwork affects us and we affect the field the book attempts to synthesize accounts of the personal experience of ethnography in doing so the author makes sense of the process of fieldwork research as a set of practical intellectual and emotional

accomplishments the book is thematically arranged and illustrated with a wide range of empirical material

classic case studies surveying the use role and function of language and speech in social life

one of anthropology's leading writers on ethnographic methods Harry Wolcott discusses the fundamental nature of ethnographic studies tracing its development from its disciplinary origins in sociology and anthropology he points out what is distinctive about ethnography and what it means to conduct research in the ethnographic tradition in this engaging and thought provoking book Wolcott distinguishes ethnography as more than just a set of field methods and practices separating it from many related qualitative research traditions as a way of seeing through the lens of culture for both beginning and experienced ethnographers in a wide range of disciplines Wolcott's book will provide important ideas for improving research practice

in its assessment of the current state of play of ethnographic practice in social anthropology this volume explores the challenges that changing social forms and changing understandings of the field pose to contemporary ethnographic methods these challenges include the implications of the remarkable impact social anthropology is having on neighboring disciplines such as history sociology cultural studies human geography and linguistics as well as the potential costs of this success for the discipline contributors also discuss how the ethnographic method is influenced by current institutional contexts and historical traditions across a range of settings here ethnography is featured less as a methodological tool box or technique but rather as a subject on which to reflect

written from the perspective of a diagnostic radiography educator this book introduces readers to ethnography as a methodology and examines how an ethnographic researcher sees the world in which they live

it is commonly acknowledged that anthropologists use personal experiences to inform their writing however it is often assumed that only fieldwork experiences are relevant and that the personal appears only in the form of self reflexivity this book takes a step beyond anthropology at home and auto ethnography and shows how anthropologists can include their memories and experiences as ethnographic data in their writing it discusses issues such as authenticity translation and ethics in relation to the self and offers a new perspective on doing ethnographic fieldwork

david m fetterman captures the ethnographic imagination with the fourth edition of his popular text ethnography step by step he shares new case examples of his work to highlight the illuminating power of reflexivity and theory the new edition expands the discussion of critical concepts such as culture contextualization emic and etic distinctions and symbols the book provides insights into the use of technology in ethnography from qualitative data analysis software to data visualization and questions for reflection have been added to the end of each chapter fetterman is a seasoned

educator evidenced by both the clarity of his thinking and the simplicity of his writing

this volume invites the reader to join in with the recent focus on subjectivity and self reflection as the means of understanding and engaging with the social and historical changes in the world through storytelling it examines the symbiosis between anthropology and fiction on the one hand by looking at various ways in which the two fields co emerge in a fruitful manner and on the other by re examining their political aesthetic and social relevance to world history following the intellectual crisis of the 1970s anthropology has been criticized for losing its ethnographic authority and vocation however as a consequence of this ethnographic scope has opened towards more subjective and self reflexive forms of knowledge and representations such as the crossing of the boundaries between autobiography and ethnography the collection of essays re introduces the importance of authorship in relationship to readership making a ground breaking move towards the study of fictional texts and images as cultural sociological and political reflections of the time and place in which they were produced in this way the contributors here contribute to the widening of the ethnographic scope of contemporary anthropology a number of the chapters were presented as papers in two conferences organised by the association of social anthropologists of the uk and commonwealth at jawaharlal nehru university new delhi entitled arts and aesthetics in a globalising world 2012 and at the university of exeter entitled symbiotic anthropologies 2015 each chapter offers a unique method of working in the grey area between and beyond the categories of fiction and non fiction while creatively reflecting upon current methodological ethical and theoretical issues in anthropology and cultural studies this is an important book for undergraduate and post graduate students of anthropology cultural and media studies art theory and creative writing as well as academic researchers in these fields
