American colonists knew just two types of public building: churches and taverns. At a time when drinking water was considered dangerous, everyone drank often and in quantity. The author explores the role of drinking and tavern sociability.

It also honors the scholarship of Gary Nash, who has contributed much of the leading work in this field. This book is a vital contribution to American self-understanding and to historical analysis.

It has often been said that early America was the best poor man's country in the world after all. Wasn't there an abundance of land and a scarcity of laborers? The law of supply and demand would seem to dictate that most early American working people enjoyed high wages and a decent material standard of living. Down and out in early America presents the evidence for poverty versus plenty and concludes that financial insecurity was a widespread problem that plagued many early Americans. The fact is that in early America only an extremely thin margin separated those who required assistance from those who were able to secure independently the necessities of life. The reasons for this were many: seasonal and cyclical unemployment, inadequate wages, health problems, including mental illness, alcoholism, a large pool of migrants, low pay for women, abandoned families. The situation was made worse by the inability of many communities to provide

transatlantic radicals uncovers the roots of their radicalism in the old world and tells the story of how these men came to be exiled how they emigrated and how they participated in the politics of their adopted country nearly all of these radicals looked to paine as their spiritual leader and to thomas jefferson as their political champion they held egalitarian anti federalist values and promoted an extreme form of participatory democracy that found a niche in the radical wing of jefferson s republican party their divided views on slavery however reveal that democratic republicanism was unable to cope with the realities of that institution as political activists during the 1790s they proved crucial to jefferson s 1800 presidential victory then after his views moderated and their influence waned many repatriated others drifted into anonymity and a few managed to find success in the new world although many of these men are known to us through other histories their influence as a group has never before been so closely examined durey persuasively demonstrates that the intellectual ferment in britain did indeed have tremendous influence on american politics his account of that influence sheds considerable light on transatlantic political history and differences in religious political and economic freedoms skillfully balancing a large cast of characters transatlantic radicals depicts the diversity of their experiences and shows how crucial these reluctant émigrés were to shaping our republic in its formative years
