exploring the language of poems plays and prose examines how readers interact with literary works how they understand and are moved by them mick short considers how meanings and effects are generated in the three major literary genres carrying out stylistic analysis of poetry drama and prose fiction in turn he analyses a wide range of extracts from english literature adopting an accessible approach to the analysis of literary texts which can be applied easily to other texts in english and in other languages

poetry defined as language divided into lines is found in most known human cultures this masterful survey of poetry and its constituent components demonstrates the functions performed by metre rhyme alliteration and parallelism arguing that each line of a poem fits as a whole unit into the limited capacity of human working memory using examples from around the world fabb surveys the wide varieties of poetry and the

ways they are performed including those in songs and signed literatures focusing on language form and memory he argues helps us understand why poetry is a particularly valued way of using language a fresh exploration of poetry the book will be welcomed by students and researchers of literature linguistics and psychology as well as anyone interested in poetry

language and world creation in poems and other texts introduces an interdisciplinary and practical approach to the analysis of poetry which focuses on text worlds namely the contexts scenarios or types of reality that readers construct in their interaction with the language of texts the book demonstrates in detail three ways of approaching poetic text worlds namely as discourse situations possible worlds and mental constructs clear and detailed introductions to linguistic theories of definiteness and deixis possible world theory and schema theory are included making the book accessible to readers who are unfamiliar with these frameworks

this book introduces a new way of looking at how poems mean drawing on the framework first developed in the author s book critical stylistics but applied here to aesthetic more than ideological meaning the aim is to empower readers of poetry to articulate the features of poetic language that they come across and explain to themselves and others why these features convey the meanings that they do while this volume focuses on contemporary poets writing in english and mostly based in the uk and ireland the framework will work just as well for other eras poetry as well as for other cultures and languages

this new selection of anglophone welsh poetry presents a range of literary responses to the french revolution and the ensuing wars with france a period in which wales and its history became prime imaginative territory for poets of all political sympathies

limits and languages in contemporary irish women s poetry examines the transactions between the two main languages of irish literature english and irish and their formative role in contemporary poetry by irish women daniela theinová explores the works of well known poets such as eavan boland eiléan ní chuilleanáin nuala ní dhomhnaill biddy jenkinson and medbh mcguckian combining for the first time a critical analysis of the language issue with a focus on the historical marginality of women in the irish literary tradition acutely alert to the textures of individual poems even as she reads these against broader critical theoretical horizons theinová engages directly with texts in both irish and english by highlighting these writers uneasy poetic and linguistic identity and by introducing into this wider context some more recent poets including vona groarke caitriona o reilly sinéad morrissey ailbhe darcy and aifric mac aodha this book proposes a fundamental critical reconsideration of major late twentieth century irish women poets and by extension the nation s canon

the encyclopedia of american poetry the twentieth century contains over 400 entries that treat a broad range of individual poets and poems along with many articles devoted to topics schools or periods of american verse in the century entries fall into three main categories poet entries which provide biographical and cultural contexts for the author s career entries on individual works which offer closer explication of the most resonant poems in the 20th century canon and topical entries which offer analyses of a given period of literary production school thematically constructed

category or other verse tradition that historically has been in dialogue with the poetry of the united states

i pray in poems explores the intersection of great works of poetry and christian faith offering meditations on what these works illustrate about christian living readers will encounter authors as diverse as william shakespeare t s eliot rumi mary oliver and anna kamienska each poem is followed by an analytical reflection that explores the work and places it within the context of one or more biblical passages these meditations will assist the reader in understanding and appreciating the poetry and will also offer insightful perhaps even inspiring thoughts on what it means to live a life in faith

irish poetry since 1950 is a survey of poetry from northern ireland the republic britain and the us covering the 1950s the 1960s the early period of the troubles up to 1976 the 1980s and the 1990s
