their historical context and examined in search of rhetorical strategies that perpetuate forms of misrecognition in the end feres jr demonstrates that long standing north american pejorative perceptions about the peoples and countries seen as latin american found abundantly in everyday language survive in social scientific discourse despite the reiterated claims of objectivity and value neutrality of the social sciences
